

A new year has come. It always brings both expectations and fear at the same time. And no matter how we feel with changes and challenges we will face, we need to accept or deal with Christian faith and values.

We see many images or symbolic pictures in the Bible and often an image delivers a more powerful message than many words. Jeremiah delivers an image for our Christian life and I want to carry it in my mind throughout the year. It comes from the Book of Jeremiah, written thousands years ago. Jeremiah writes about two images, taken from the vision that he heard from God. But it still prompts us take and carry this value through our faith journey as a follower of Christ Jesus. He writes, “The one who trusts in man, who depends on flesh for his strength and whose heart turns away from the Lord” is like “a bush in the wastelands, while **“the man who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him” will be like “a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream.”** He urges us to live with trust in God for this is the life bearing fruit abundantly (Jeremiah 17:5-8).

Faith is two-way relationship and action. We receive God’s love as our own and respond to God. Paul the Apostle is a role model for the followers of Jesus. He was unashamedly principled and lived out God-centered principles in challenging moments of life. Surely he also struggled and faltered but he always tried to be faithful. It is told in his letter to Christians in Philippi, “I do not consider that I have made it my own. But **one thing I do**, forgetting what lies behind, but straining forward to what lies ahead. I press on toward the goal, for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.” We Christians are called to follow in his footsteps as he followed Jesus’ example.

 Last week (January 20<sup>th</sup> --22<sup>nd</sup>), I, with seven others from our church, attended a conference—for three long days—in Fort Myers, Florida. We together experienced a church which had been known for its vitality in ministries. It was a powerful and timely experience for us all. This church demonstrated their strong sense of Christian faith and passionate commitment to the mission and ministry for the Kingdom of God.

Let me share one of many things I have learned. It is about their core values they cherish as a church. This one tells what they do as a church together and how they do it. I believe it will help us with what values we need to keep or cultivate both as a church and a Christian.

Grace Church’s core values are defined with three phrases, “Unashamedly God-centered,” “Passionately People-focused,” and “Strategically Team-based.”

They declared that they were “**unashamedly God-centered.**” Ministry is not about us but God ultimately. Only when we truly accept and acknowledge this we will know what is important and essential in ministry and life as a church.

The people of the Grace Church defined their mission and ministry as “**Passionately People-focused.**” It was both biblical and contextually relevant. If you read the Book of Acts, you will see ministry focus of the first Christian community was on people. According to this value, their ministry focus was directed and redirected.

They also repeatedly emphasized their way of doing ministry as “**Strategically Team-based.**” The Grace Church’s leadership emphasized the significance of team, teamwork, team play, team ministry almost every moment of talking about ministry.

 We, followers of Jesus, are called to live out Christian faith and value, to faithfully answer to the command of Jesus Christ, and make disciples of Jesus in all circumstances. This last command of Jesus should be remembered and practiced in life again and again.

## WHO IS ADULT FORUM?

Members and friends of McKownville Church beyond high school age interested in discussing faith issues, both historical and current. Members select topics and members lead. Each is encouraged to suggest and perhaps lead a topic of particular personal interest.

## WHAT IS ADULT FORUM?

Adult Forum is adult Sunday School at McKownville Church.. A forum is an open place where new, difficult, or unusual ideas and questions may be posed and discussed. Format varies in style and content. Rather than traditional "Bible Study" focusing on a specific text, we look at issues and their possible resolution, making reference to Biblical examples. Past activities included watching a full length movie and then discussing the action or characters from a Christian point of view, discussing "foreigners" and "strangers", and study of the Church's historic creeds. It is OK to ask an "impossible" question. Come, bring a suggestion with you!

## WHEN IS ADULT FORUM?

Adult Forum meets almost every week, and we meet at two different times. Traditional Sunday School happens Sunday morning and we meet 9:30-10:30 am . But many persons interested in our program have a conflict with that time: a preference for contemporary worship or volunteering for other needs: music, children, youth. These folks are accommodated by a Monday evening session 7:00-8:00 pm . Some persons attend both sessions, and the details of time are set by each group. Leadership usually is the same for both groups, but that can be a decision of each group. The program is the same each Sunday/Monday dates. Cross attendance is encouraged.

## WHERE IS ADULT FORUM?

Adult Forum meets in the multipurpose room, halfway down the corridor of Sunday School rooms, across from the library.

## WHY IS ADULT FORUM?

Most of us in present-day society end our formal education when we become adults. But we all continue to learn, either by "continuing education" or by experience. This sense of a need to learn carries over into religious or moral topics. Adult Forum seeks to meet this need by expanding understanding of Church theology (what we believe and how that belief has changed over the years), Church history (our beginning, our heritage from others, our gifts to others, steps and miss-steps along the way, splits and unions, concerns then and concerns today, resolution of issues and still-open contentions), and intersection of the religious and secular worlds. We are open to learning about issues and events in our modern world that impact our perceptions of God and history.






## Adult Study

Beginning on Sunday February 19th, there will be a box in the back of the Sanctuary where you can place your sock donations. Thank you in advance for your support.




## June Service in the Park
