PASTOR'S MESSAGE

While I was reading articles on the terrorist attacks in Brussels, Belgium, my heart was deeply troubled again. My heart goes out to the people in Brussels, who are suffering from the attacks of terrorists. It is sad to see that our world has been enshrouded not by hope, joy, and peace, but beleaguered by fear, hate, anger, and violence. And some Christians douse us with more fear, hate, and violence.

Anger and fear are natural responses to cruel and inhuman acts but we are not overwhelmed by those negative emotions. It seems we are living in an almost uncontrollable world, I feel this way for the moment and think of being and living as a Christian. Being a Christian means following Jesus' teachings and his footsteps. No Christians is perfect, but we're expected to live out the criteria that Jesus had lived and taught us, when we confessed Jesus as our personal Lord and Savior.

We Christians are to acknowledge and embrace differences and diversity as our principled values in all circumstances. A mosaic is a good illustration for this motto. A mosaic is a design made up of small pieces which makes a beautiful picture only when each piece embraces and acknowledges one another. Harper Leer chimes with this in her book, To Kill a Mockingbird, "If you can learn a simple trick, Scout," Atticus advises his daughter, "you'll get along a lot better with all kinds of folks. You never really understand a person until you consider things from his point of view... until you climb into his skin and walk around in it." What he said is in line with the words that Paul the apostle of the Bible wrote to the church in Rome, "For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. Toe the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law... so that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law... so that I might win those outside the law. To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become things to all people, that I might by all means save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings" (Romans 9:19-23).

We just celebrated Easter this past week. Easter teaches us that life prevails by defeating death, light by defeating darkness, love by defeating hatred, hope by defeating despair...

Let me provide some more biblical passages for our moral, spiritual discernment and judgements. I feel we need to hear these verses now more than ever.

"Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer... Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another...Do not repay anyone evil for evil... No, 'if you enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads.' Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." (Romans 12:14-21).

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven ... For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet only your brothers and sisters, what more are you doing than others? Be perfect, therefore, as you heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:38-48).

HISTORICAL NOTE:

50 Years Ago: McKownville Methodist Church celebrated "A Century of Faith" in 1966.

1966 was McKownville's centennial year and the church also celebrated 200 years of Methodism in America. A contemporary sanctuary and educational wing had been built 1959/1960.

In 1966 the pastors were James E. Beskin assisted part-time by Ralton M. Speers. The Church Secretary worked Tuesday through Friday from 8:30 until noon. The Chancel Choir rehearsed Thursday evenings from 7 - 8:30 p.m. Methodist Youth Fellowship met Sunday evenings in two age divisions for grades 7-9 and 10 - 12. The Woman's Society of Christian Service met the second Wednesday of each month. Methodist Men met the second Monday of each school month starting with a supper. There was also a Couples Club and a Faith and Friendship Group.

30 Hour Famine Update: 6 youth and two adults participated in our 30 Hour Famine Lock In (and Pastor Charlie fasted along with us in support! Thanks Charlie) During the event, youth learned first-hand what it feels like to be truly hungry, what challenges can come from not knowing where your next meal is coming from, and saw interactive video of a child in Kenya facing the challenges of Hunger and Poverty. Through pledge support and our First Ever Spaghetti Dinner, the group raised \$450 which will be sent to World Vision. We go hungry to help hungry kids. Our students were encouraged to grow closer to Christ and each other as they fast together for 30 hours and raise funds to fight hunger. What's more, when we did the Famine we were challenging our students to be part of something bigger than themselves. To take action for God's kingdom. To help save the lives of hungry kids. To permanently change the way your students see the world.
