A few weeks ago, I read an article, written by David Brook, a New York Times columnist, under the title, *How would Jesus Drive? This* reminds me of WWJD (What would Jesus do?)

which had challenged many Christians who took their life and faith seriously a few decades ago. That article led me to think about what has been happening both in our country and in our Christianity.

When we confess ourselves as Christian, a follower of Jesus Christ, we decide to follow how Jesus and the Bible taught us to live. Of course there is no utterly pure agreement on the creeds and doctrines that we are ought to follow, but when we confess ourselves as Christians, we are expected to live by the ethics and values that Jesus taught and lived. And certainly Christian characters and criteria for morality are higher than the secular world expects, when Jesus and his followers set the moral and ethical bar. A basic premise of being a Christian is that no matter if one likes it or not, the high expectations of God for our lives cannot be changed. But in recent times, what we have seen is the criticism that we Christians have been lowering the moral bar. It is ironic that secular society has been expecting a higher standard of morality and integrity than some Christian leaders and Christians have demonstrated. Some Christians speak as if morality and character are no longer important or relevant, and act as if character doesn't matter to Christianity. They conveniently bend or apply selectively to life or compromise their character and integrity.

Certainly nobody is perfect and everybody will fail in meeting the expectations of God for life. But it doesn't mean that we can't distort or apply our Christian values and moralities to situations in a selective way. We cannot give up being Christians, or give up some core values and principles no matter how menacingly our situation forces us to bend our Christian values. When Christians give up living by the values and teachings that Jesus taught and lived by, we give up living as Christians.

What Jesus said in the Sermon on the Mount reverberates louder in our ears than any time before, "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot"

Christian values and morality have been normal for our discernment, decision, and determination in following Jesus every day. In a situation for moral discernment and judgement like now, we have to choose if we will become less Christian, or live fully as Christians.

It is one thing if we decide to live up to the expectation of God, and it is another if we live as we decide. But in any situation we should not lower our Christian standard to justify what we do or what we do not do when we go against the words of God. When we give up living up to the criteria of Christian faith, we give up being a hope for the world. I think it's time to ask, WWJD, again in life.





I continued my daily prayer for them everyday. Fathima pregnancy and the growth of baby was went well. Every time when I go Basha's Meat shop I thank God for his joy and peace. He said to me ," My Allah (God Almighty) will bless you and your family." My faith experiences God was connected me so many different religious family and the love of God is the same to every one.

I requested to Basha inform to me if his wife will have labor symptom. He said that he will. Fathima had regular check up with Dr. K. Kabir MD. She was a Hindu and married Muslim. We three different traditional faith people served to see a baby for Basha and Fathima. God is full of love he made this connection for a miracle. Fathima's due for delivering of the baby was March, 2nd week 1988.

On March, 18th, 1988 myself and my older son 13 years old and my younger so 10 years old. We went to visit our relatives in the morning. Then in the after noon we traveled by bus to come back to our home. The bus stop was near the 'PRIVATE HOSPITAL' where Dr. K. Kabir's her own Maternity Clinic and her patient's will have private special room as they needed. Our bus was stopped near this hospital after we came out of the bus it came in my heart this," Fathima is due this week why not I go inside the hospital to ask Dr.K.Kabir about her delivery preparation. Because I promised Basha and his wife I will be with them during the delivery.

I asked my son's to visit if they at the Hospital and they agreed. We walked and passed the main entrance of the hospital. I saw Basha was running to-word's us. I thank the Lord, but when he comes near us, he cried loudly and said," sister Fathima is admitted this morning. Dr.K.Kabir want to do C-sections because the baby is big and over weight. I am very fearful and the doctor is waiting for some one."

I started worrying, and walked to Dr.K.Kabir's room. The moment I put my feet inside her room she said in a loud volume of voice, "You are an angel God sends you. I want to do C-section for Fathima but the electrical power off and the scheduled OR Nurse called for sick. I am telling you again God send you as an angel to help Fathima. She gave a bunch of key's and said to me, Run to the OR get scrubbed, set up operating table and everything ready. The Anesthetist is on the way let us do it."

I looked at my son's, Dr.K.Kabir said ," Don't worry about the boy's they are going to be safe with my car driver and he will watch them and buy food and everything. Just run and get

ready." I got the keys, and started running from one building to another where the OR is. At the same time I started asking the Lord Jesus Christ, "Lord without light how am I going to Scrub and arrange all the instrument's and get ready for the surgery. I need light." I continue my running with my prayer.

Wait for another miracle and to be continue.


McKownville United Methodist Church typically holds a confirmation class every 2 years—and this is one of the years!



Homelessness and the need for additional shelter beds in Albany County continue to be a focus for the Capital Area Council of Churches (CACC). It is our belief that all people, regardless of a person's circumstances and behaviors, have a human right to obtain shelter from deadly weather and dangerous street-living. Since 2000 the CACC and First Lutheran Church of Albany have responded to this crisis by providing an Emergency Overflow Shelter with professionally trained staff, operating through the cold weather months, 7 days a week, 12 hours each day.

Children, Youth and Adults from around the capital region will be participating in the fund-raising event. The event is open to all! Students from Cornerstone Campus Ministry at the University at Albany will be assisting the planning team with hosting the event. Participants will be encouraged to get pledges and work towards our common goal of raising at least \$10,000 towards the work of the shelter.




