Recently I purposely thought of the word "gratitude"— of course I preached on the topic serval times because I feel I have not been grateful to God these days. So, I decided to talk about gratitude in this newsletter.

Gratitude or thankfulness is a key for the fruitful relationship. Words of compliment or appreciations are powerful boosts for any relationship. The church community is not different at all. The best way to strengthen unity in the church community is to support and assist one another in being the best we can be.

Charles Duhigg is an investigative reporter for The New York Times. He talks about how habits work in his excellent book, *the Power of Habit*. He argues that people would say they don't have any habits but everybody does. He talks about a Duke University researcher who in 2006 found that more than 40 percent of the actions people performed each day weren't actual decisions, but habits. Habits can either cultivate or destroy positive climate. We can remake our lives in relatively short periods of time. Focus on one pattern—what is known as a "keystone habit." He pushes us to reprogram to positive routines in our life. If we want to live a better life, what we need to do is to eradicate bad the habits from life. But eradicating a bad habit is not enough. We have to replace it with something positive. We have to develop a good habit instead. Cultivating a good habit requires effort, energy, time, and routine. And developing a habit of gratitude is a key to the success in any relationship.

Words of compliment or appreciation are powerful boosts for any relationship—it is true even in our relationship with God. The best way to strengthen a relationship is to support and assist one another in being the best one can be. And it can be realized by expressing our thankfulness to others as frequently as we can. It can be begin with expressing gratitude for a trivial thing in every day life. There is no better language than expressing gratitude and thankfulness. If our lives have more words of thankfulness and encouragement, our world will be a more livable place for all of us. Paul often talks about the significance of using good languages in his letters. "Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear" (Ephesians 4:29, NIV). "Watch the way you talk. Let nothing foul or dirty come out of your mouth. Say only what helps, each word a gift" (4:29, the Message). All of Scripture calls us to live in a posture of thankfulness, first to God and then to other people. That's what we do when we gather for worship. We pause and say "Thank you, God, for all the blessings."

Let us be thankful and say "Thank you" more often in any situation. Only the people who are thankful to God can be true Christians. My prayer is that all of us in McKownville become thankful people along with all the people outside of our church. Thank you Lord.

Pastor Charlie (Cheol-Hee) Yang and his family; wife Euni, son Dasol, and daughter Grace joined us in July 2014.

Charlie preached and taught us about his WELLS model. This led our church to understand that Worship, Evangelism, Learning, Loving, and Sharing are fundamental to being dedicated disciples of Christ. Charlie doesn't just teach the WELLS Model, he practices the Wells Model as seen by everything he has done for our church.

When Pastor Charlie arrived at our church one of his first goals was to start a new style of worship. While working with many people, he was able to make this happen and today we have a successful Praise service. However, to make the new service work, a new sound system was needed to replace our old, worn out system. Again, through his leadership and persistence, a new sound and video system was researched and selected, and a fund raiser was successfully organized to raise enough funds for our now new audio-sound system. By making the new Praise service a reality, MUMC now provides two distinct and different worship experiences.

One of Charlie's strengths is that of preaching. His sermons provoke thought, reflection and stir the Holy Spirit in us!

Charlie knew that home/small groups were central to developing healthy relationships in the church. With his guidance and encouragement a few small groups were started and are still active today.

Charlie also introduced the concept of a mosaic church to us so that we may better understand what it means to be a more multi-cultural church.

We learned that Charlie is a strong believer in the power of prayer. During his time with us he witnessed to us how important prayer is and how it has influenced his and Euni's spiritual life. This led MUMC to strengthen our prayer ministry and as a result, people in the church set up prayer boxes both in the church and the community. In addition, a small group has taken on the responsibility of praying for those who submit prayer requests.

During Charlie's time with us he introduced the phrase "Spirit Filled, Mission Driven" to describe who we are as a church. Charlie has also been a spiritual care giver for those in time of need. He routinely makes out of church visits to those who need spiritual support and prayer.

Part of Charlie's call was to grow our church. He was able to identify and send eight church members to attend a weekend conference at Grace Church in Florida with the goal of using this group and the ideas from this conference to grow the church. This group returned from this experience transformed by what they learned, formed a Resource Team to continue to bring new ideas and practices to both our church and the Albany District.

Charlie always makes sure to greet everyone at Sunday morning worship. Welcoming everyone to church is extremely important to him and Euni. So we cannot really talk about Charlie without mentioning his wife Euni; she has been such a pleasure to have in our church. She readily welcomes all who step into the church, as welcoming is also extremely important to her. Euni always has a smile on her face and is so friendly. She fills in wherever needed, often setting up coffee hour and making sure there are ushers during Praise service. She has been a huge help for many Christmas dinners, assisting in the kitchen and helping with food preparation. She provided a Korean meal as the first fund raiser for the sound system.

It has been a pleasure to have Grace and Dasol around. Grace has spent the last two years at college in Boston and we wish her the best as she continues on this journey. Dasol has become active in the Praise Band, Bell choir and children's music program after graduating from college and is now moving on for more schooling in Colorado. We wish him the best in his continuing life journey.

The Yang family has had a positive impact in the spiritual life of McKownville UMC and will be missed. A big "Thank You" to Charlie and his family for what they have done for McKownville UMC! May God bless the Yang family as they each move on in their next phase of life.


STATUS OF OUR FINANCIAL CAMPAIGN

Open Hearts, Open Hands! Giving to advance God's work!

The formal portion of our annual financial campaign is complete. It began the week after Easter. We heard about the importance of McKownville Church to members and friends; we learned about our collective giving for the past fiscal year; we were challenged about what our money would say if it could talk. Each of us was asked to pray daily for success in the campaign and we were urged to consider thoughtfully our response to this appeal. Commitment Sunday April 29 we answered.

Commitment Sunday we received 28 pledges for \$125,796. Additional pledges over the next two weeks brought the mid-May results to 40 pledges totally \$154,328. This is, as we say, good news and not-so-good news. Good news: this campaign's pledge average of \$3860/year (\$75/week) is up significantly from last year's \$2970/year (\$58/week). The not-so-good news: just 40 pledges this year, significantly fewer than last year's 64 that pledged \$190,284. Good news: many persons who pledged last year make a commitment again this year. Not-so-good news: no first-time pledgers and \$36,000 short of last year's total.

Thank you to each person or family that pledged financial support for next year. We appreciate your continued support and confidence in our future. If you have not yet indicated support for the coming fiscal year 7/1/18 through 6/30/19, there is still a chance! Put your pledge in an envelope and place it in the offering plate, or mail it to McKownville U M C, c/o Financial Secretary, 1565 Western Avenue, Albany NY 12203. And, while your pledge of financial support is important, don't forget the other ways we are called: Pray often, worship Sunday mornings, serve others where you see an unfilled need, and live a life that reveals the living Christ.






