

Let us thank the Lord, Jesus Christ, for all his help during the last snow storm. Let us pray for the coming changes of the seasons. Praise God we are entering the February, the second month of the year.

Let us look around at the believers and non-believers who need our prayers and help from God. There are so many changes happening in the work place. Many people are working without receiving their salaries. Many have jobs, but their work places are shut down. This is a tremendous change and it makes it difficult for their daily lives.

Many people are praying and supporting them. Some of them may say, "Is God watching us and all of our difficulties." There is an answer for them in the scriptures. "For eyes of the Lord range throughout the entire earth, to strengthen those whose heart is true to him." (II Chronicles 16:9)

This scripture reading is a comfort for them, knowing that God is watching them. He will bring good news for every one of them.

Let us trust God and he will strengthen us to walk through these difficulties. Again, God gives us courage through the following scriptures that says, "Deal courageously and may the Lord e with the good" (II Chronicles 19:11).

Many people are waiting for their healing from their sickness. Once a person becomes sick, they will sometimes loose their faith. They will ask God so many questions. The elderly woman was an ordained minister's wife and she was 90 years old. She was bedridden and she developed bed sores on the lower portion of her back located in her spinal cord. The wound was nearly one and a half inches in depth and she was suffering in much pain. Her daughter finally came to me and asked me for help with her wound. Of course, the elderly woman had medications prescribed by her physician as well. I offered my nursing care for the wound and went daily to her home and cared for the wound. I felt that the Lord, Jesus Christ, appointed me not only to be a nurse and caregiver but as a praying servant for her total healing from the bed sore.

Before I started the wound care, I asked the Lord, Jesus Christ, Lord you said to Isaiah, "By your bruises we are healed." Pour out your healing power in these wound dressings and sterile medicated solutions. Let not by my fingers heal the wound; but, let your nailed and bruised fingers touch the bed sore. Let the wound be totally healed by your healing power in your name and give her a longer life. Amen."

Everyday I prayed the above prayer and continued the wound care. Within a month, the wound had completely healed. She was able to get out of the bed and live another five years. She had more time to enjoy her life with her family. I never forgot her smile and her thanks to me. I thanked God that he honored me and used me as an instrument for his healing power.

I would like to encourage those who are suffering with sickness to look to the Lord of Healer, Jesus Christ. Now, let us bow our heads and bend on our knees and offer our prayers. The Lord, Jesus Christ, is a compassionate and loving Savior for us. He works in a mysterious way by his mercy. Don't ever be discouraged.

Let us pray: "Lord of Healer, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Lay your healing bruised hands on us. Heal all our sickness, tiredness and weakness. Touch our medications with your healing power. Bless the doctors and nurses who are helping us. Heal us totally and deliver us from all the sickness. Let us become your witness of your healing power. In your precious name we ask this. Amen.

## HOW CAN WE BE MORE GENEROUS?

In the past year our church has been busy and generous. Within the past 6 months, 6 flood buckets have been assembled and donated to help those effected by flooding or other natural disasters. Six more people will be able to clean up after a flood. With the spare change from everyone's pockets, \$146 was given to the Campus Ministries at SUNY Albany. More college students will be given the opportunity to feel God's love and spread God's love. Christmas is a more active giving time of year, at our church it was no different. Donations of \$128 from the Christmas Party were given to the Jamie Bowen Fund. Now more people can get assistance for their medical bills that they might not have been able to afford any other way. Christmas Eve continued the giving with the collection of \$1154 after the service. The money was divided evenly between three groups to help even more people. The Refugee and Immigrant Support Services at Emmaus (RISSE) will be able to offer more services to help refugees and immigrants build sustainable lives in U.S. through after school programs, English classes for adults and assisting individuals and families find housing, employment, medical care, school information and more. RISSE also received the hats, mittens, scarves and toys from our "mitten tree". The Capital Area Council of Churches, both the CROP hunger walk and the overflow homeless shelter will be able to help feed more people. What will we give next?

## **The Forty Days of Lent**

Lent, the 40 days (not including Sundays) between Ash Wednesday and Easter, is a time of devotion and focus. Many Christian followers give up something in their daily routine as a sacrifice to honor this season and as a symbol of the fasting that Christ did during the 40 days he spent in the desert. Fasting and sacrifice in this way are devotions of ourselves to focus our minds and hearts on God as we prepare for Easter.

This year as we prepare for the season of Lent, we are asking everyone to participate in two ways with a special Lenten project. Here is how you can get involved:

- 1. Write a short devotion, in preparation for Lent. We will be collecting and compiling a 40 day devotional written by US to reflect on through the season of Lent. A devotion should include a scripture, and anecdote or story related to the scripture or theme, and a short prayer. Do you have a favorite passage? Has someone ever interpreted a scripture in a way you would like to share? Has something meaningful happened that you feel called to share. Email your submissions to Pastor Jeff or to the church office. We will compile the booklet with 40 devotions to be handed out on Ash Wednesday and the Sunday to follow.
- 2. During Lent, Donate! Take one item out of your home pantry to donate to the Guilderland Food Pantry. Along with the devotions, we will be distribute a calendar of suggested pantry items to donate. Set these items aside in a collection box at home. Set aside one item per day- like a reversed Advent Calendar! Rather than giving up something like eating Chocolate for the whole season of Lent, give up one pantry item per day to give to those who need it. You should end up with a box of 40 items to donate to the GFP at the end of the season!

We will have our shared devotion books, the calendar of giving and a box to put your offering into available in the back of the sanctuary starting on Ash Wednesday. We hope you will join us in this Journey through Lent together!

## <u>Historical Notations on Shortened Budget Year</u> <u>April 1957 - December 1957</u>


Church budget year: In 1992/1993 McKownville UMC transitioned from a calendar year to a financial fiscal year (July 1 - June 30). Similarly, the church budget year had earlier transitioned in 1957/58 from a budget year of April 1, 1956 to March 31, 1957 to a budget for April 1 - December 31, 1957 followed by a full calendar year budget January 1, December 31, 1958.

Methodist Men service projects: "Two major service projects have marked the year. One, the removal of the old organ and the renovation and repair for the installation of the new organ." [The old organ was the 1927 rebuilt one manual pipe organ in the 1898 sanctuary, now Wesley Chapel. Its replacement was a 1957 electric Allen organ with vacuum tubes funded by the Emma Scott Legacy. This organ lasted until an Allen digital computer Organ was installed in the 1960 sanctuary in 1991.] "Second, the Methodist Men, following the leveling of the Parking Lot contracted by the Trustees, provided and built the very adequate rail[road ties] fence along the Western Avenue side of the parking lot in order to conform with State requirements." [Neighboring land had been purchased in 1953 - adding to the original 1865 one acre. Tree removal, grading and fill were needed to create off-road parking on part of the land. Monies from land taken by the Thruway helped with the mortgage. In 1960 a new paved lot was added in conjunction with the construction of the larger sanctuary and education wing.]

Commission on Mission: "The Commission, Mrs. Floyd Johnston, President, reports a strengthening of the Missions outreach of our Church in many ways during the report period. Adopted as a part of the total budget of the Church for the coming year was a Missions commitment of nearly 20% of the total budget asking. [This included World Service, Troy Conference Development Fund, and other benevolences.] The Commission has had to postpone plans for its School of Missions at least temporarily at Silver Bay in July.

([In 2010 Troy Annual Conference was split; the NYS part joined with North Central New York Conference, Western New York Conference, and the NYS part of Wyoming Conference to form Upper New York Conference (UNY). UNY runs three Schools of Christian Mission, MissionU, with one in September back at Silver Bay after Troy Conference had it elsewhere for many years.]

Pastor's Report (by Rev. Charles J. Warner who was at McKownville for the 1956 - 1964 appointment years): ..High Points of the Year: 1. Bible Study and Prayer Group initiated; 2. Mortgage retirement; 3. Building Plans approved and Crusade launched [for larger sanctuary & educational wing needed to have "adequate facilities to serve a growing community"]; 4. Organ installed and dedicated; 5. Deepening missionary interest and activity; 6. Increased attendance, membership and participation; 7. Youth Sunday Observance; 8. Laymen's Sunday; 9. WSCS [Women's Society of Christian Service - which later became United Methodist Women] and Methodist Men's gains; 10. High quality musical program.
