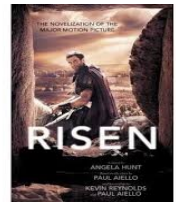
## PRAAYER CHAIN MESSAGE

McKownville United Methodist Church, our church, has a presence at Western Avenue and Church Road. We impact our neighborhood. Our neighbors know we are here. Through our connection with Albany District and Upper New York Annual Conference we are connected to other Methodist churches in New York State and around the world. We influence many of the people who merely drive by. **JUST IMAGINE** our full influence on this part of the world.

We are called to support our church with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. Our annual Financial Campaign focuses specifically on our gift of money. Each of us should consider thoughtfully the generous gifts we have received from a loving Lord and then show our gratitude by returning a portion to God through the Church. We begin the process of planning for the coming year by asking each to think about a specific commitment toward the work of the Lord through McKownville Church.

Our Campaign, announced in March and ending two weeks after Easter, culminates in a collective presentation of our pledges during worship Sunday, May 5. We will tally the pledges and announce a total on Celebration Sunday, May 12. For a successful campaign, we seek and need the help of every member and friend of McKownville Church.

Our campaign slogan **IMAGINE THAT!** urges us to think beyond our usual needs. Of course, we must pay our pastor and staff, must have adequate heat, light, educational materials, office supplies, and must maintain our physical facilities. We are frugal in our operation. But what might we do with a little more? **IMAGINE** new ministries to share Christ with our neighbors. **IMAGINE** becoming more welcoming. **IMAGINE** becoming more alive. **IMAGINE** what additional gifts might do! **IMAGINE** growing your gift!

This may seem a strange month to make a financial pledge. Many churches have their financial campaign in the Fall. But the Fiscal Year at McKownville Church begins each July 1 and ends the following June 30. We are asking for your financial support for Fiscal Year July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

Right now, you can do two things to support this campaign: (1) pray each day for success; (2) consider thoughtfully your response to this appeal in light of God's generosity to you. # TRUE NORTH



True North is defined as the direction that points to the true north pole. This is different than what we would see on a compass, as the compass points toward the *magnetic* north pole, which is slightly different than true north.

True North is also a term frequently used to describe moral values or the direction of our *moral compass*. Perhaps you have used the phrase or been in a conversation where someone referenced moral standards in terms of a moral compass pointing *true north*.

*Why would our morals be described in these navigational terms? Well, for one, true north never changes, the north pole sits at the top of our world. It's always there, and regardless of how lost we may be, we can always get back on track if first we know where true north is. And from a moral perspective, the analogy seems to work. If we know what our moral standard should be, we can redirect ourselves and get pointed back in the right direction if we take a wrong turn! But do we know what our moral standard is? Is it the same for all of us? Is there one True North that we are all pointing toward?*

From a Christian perspective, these questions are answered with two words... **The Cross**. The Cross defines the true north of our Faith. While moral standards can differ and be debated, the Cross cannot. What Jesus did on the Cross for us is clear and rock solid. There is no confusion, and the story has not changed for over two thousand years.

As we continue our journey through this Lenten Season, our compass of Faith will continue to point directly to the Cross, the Cross where Jesus gave up His life for us so we could live. He is on the Cross that brought us from sin to salvation, and from death to eternal life.

Whenever we feel we've lost our way, we know exactly where to go. With all the winding and twisting roads we take throughout our lives, we need only to set our internal GPS to **The Cross** to be pointed back in the right direction. Jesus is there waiting for us, as He always is.

Let's finish this Lenten season taking the one and only walk that can bring us to our eternal lives with Jesus. Our true north will always point to **The Cross**.

"Blood of Christ")



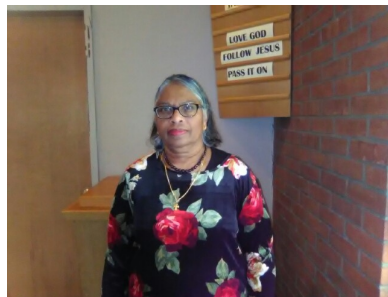

## Brooks Chicken BBQ

**Saturday May 4**

**11:00 am to 7:00 pm**

Our Spring BBQ is nearly here! Twice a year we partner with Brooks Chicken BBQ to offer a tasty chicken dinner for ourselves and for the public. Brooks cooks and flavors, we prepare, serve, package, and clean-up. There is much to be done, before and on BBQ Day. Lots of hands make light work! Matt Steffens and Henry Walter (highly experienced from BBQ October 2018) will manage.

### GOALS MAY 4

\* We plan to sell 1200 chicken dinners (800 Take-Out, 150 Dine-In, 250 Chicken-Only). We need a corresponding number of baked potatoes, rolls, and cuts of cake. That means we need many helpers. Sign-up sheets will be posted in the rear of the sanctuary starting April 7.

Is this goal ambitious? Yes, but not overly ambitious. October 2018 we sold 1030 meals (716 take-out; 120 eat-in, 211 chicken-only).

### NEW MAY 4

\* We will offer full dinner (chicken, baked potato, roll, cup of slaw, piece of cake) as Take-Out or Dine-In for \$12 each. We will offer Chicken-only for \$9. There will be no child's dinner (we sold only 4 last October).

\* Dine-In will be "self-serve," not "served." Patrons will receive their food on a disposable plate and bring it to a table. Condiments and drinks will be provided on a side table. Tables will be farther apart for ease of access.

\* Charge cards will be accepted along with cash. We offered this on a trial basis October 2018, with good results.

### WHAT WE NEED

\* **CAKE BAKERS:** Beginning April 7, pick up a foil cake pan from the rear of the sanctuary. Each pan takes two boxes of cake mix to make a mini-sheet cake that will make 32 cuts. (Please follow the details included in each pan. White or

chocolate cake, vanilla or chocolate icing, no nuts because of allergies.) *Need: 32 cakes!*

Bring the baked and iced cakes to the Social Hall between 10am and 5pm Friday May 3. Cakes will be cut and boxed that evening. Need: Six cutters and boxers for two hours!

\* **SLAW MIXERS:** Friday May 3, we will prepare slaw using our secret recipe. If you can keep a secret, you are qualified to mix slaw. Need: Six people for three hours!

\* **ROLL WRAPPERS:** Saturday May 4, at the exciting hour of 8:00 am we wrap diner rolls in a sandwich bag. No experience needed, we will train. Need: Six people for three hours!

\* **TICKET SELLERS, CHICKEN SERVERS, DINING ROOM HELPERS, TRAFFIC CONTROL, AND CLEAN-UP FOLKS!** Saturday May 4 all day these and other tasks need to be done. We plan for two shifts: 11am-3pm and 3pm-7pm. Need: 12 people each shift. Please sign up promptly so your managers may sleep at night.

\* Publicity went out mid-March to many local media outlets. Invite your friends. Better yet, invite a stranger!

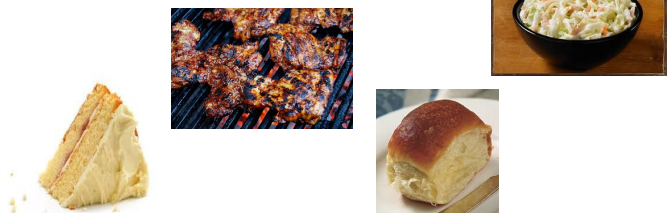
\* Scouts are ready to wrap baking potatoes in foil Thursday May 2. (1260 potatoes!)

## *JOHN U. MILLER MEMORIAL CROP WALK* *MAY 5, 2019*

Albany's first CROP walk stepped off in 1981. Three hundred walkers went 10 miles through Albany and raised \$11,000; in 2018, 350 people walked a much shorter distance but raised \$104,897! Of that amount, \$26,230.50 was shared among 26 food pantries and soup kitchens in Albany County and one food pantry in Rensselaer County. The remaining \$78,666.50 went to Church Wide Services to deal with hunger and many other issues abroad. From the first year to the last year, this event has raised \$2,274,186, of that amount \$568,546.50 was used locally.

Normally statistics are really boring; but, here are some figures which make these numbers meaningful. As of 2017, the population of this nation was 327 million people, of which, 36.2 million (11.84%) are in need of help with hunger issues! Globally, the numbers are absolutely staggering. Of the 7.4 billion people in the world, 815 million (or 11%) are undernourished!!

I know right now we are hearing a great deal about money for a variety of causes. Given the scope of this problem; however, we simply cannot forget about it. To be fair, we are not forgetting that we are supporting the Guilderland Food Pantry with cash and food donations. The Albany CROP Walk certainly isn't forgetting. Last year, this event was ranked 5th out of the top 100 "Cream of the CROP Walks" in terms of money raised! Considering there are some 900 such events nationwide every year, this is an amazing accomplishment. But we cannot rest on our laurels. The need continues and is an ever-growing problem. Our efforts must keep up with the needs, and we can do so. The actual walk offers two options: 1) A three mile loop for the healthy; and 2) a one mile loop for those of us who are less healthy. In terms of money, I have 20 packets. If each person took a packet and raised \$100, that would be \$2,000! (Last year four people, including yours truly, donated \$875). These numbers are more than reasonable. Last year one person, BY HERSELF, raised \$3,500! Two churches each had over 20 walkers and they raised over \$20,000 EACH! Our own First United Methodist Church in Delmar raised the most money 12 years in a row. And last year came in a close second (Westminster Presbyterian Church raised just a little more money.)

I have walked probably 20 of these events over the years, and sponsored others when I was unable to walk for health reasons. I did walk last year and plan on doing so this year and for as long as possible.

When I started living on my own in January 1962, I learned quickly what it meant to be hungry. I had a cheap apartment in a bad section of Albany and washed dishes for the Fort Orange Club for \$1.00/hour! My apartment was cold and damp because it had a leaky roof. Sometimes I wondered what I was going to do for something to eat. I never forgot those days; and, I'm sure many of you have similar memories. This is why I walk. Please join me as a walker or as a sponsor!

## *Roast Beef Dinner*

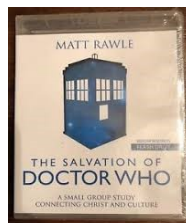
