20/20 VISION

Did we all set our goals and resolutions for the New Year. *What do we want to accomplish? What do we want to say about this year one year from now?? Do we have a 2020 vision??? Did we take the time to think about what our vision would be for the year, or do we let the year kind of happen to us?* Looking ahead to another year, and new decade can be both exciting and scary. We have hopes and plans, but we can also have our reservations on whether or not things will go as expected.



A 2020 vision,..., an interesting concept. It suggests we have a vision for the year that's sharp and clear. 20-20 vision is our benchmark standard for our eyesight. *But how many of us have it?* It seems like most of us need some type of corrective lenses for either distance or near to see things clearly.

As we begin the New Year, how do we look ahead and see the things we need to see? None of us can predict the future, but we can look through the proper "lenses" to begin to see our world more clearly. *How do we see things clearly*? For those of us that wear corrective lenses, we know that a very skilled and educated doctor examined our eyes to exactly match our eyesight to a set of lenses that allow us to see. 

On Saturday, February 8, 2020, the Cornerstone Campus Ministry will be hosting the annual "Bowling for Beds" Bowl-A-Thon to raise money for the Emergency Overflow Homeless Shelter in Albany. The event will be held at Del Lane, 4 Bethlehem Court in Delmar and will include: 2 games of bowling, shoes, pizza & soda and lots of prizes and other "free-bees" donated by businesses and community organizations. McKownville UMC will have a team bowling 2:30 – 4:30 pm. If you are interested in joining a bowling team, please see Angela Stott ASAP to reserve a spot. A limited number of spaces are available. A minimum of \$25 in pledges is required to participate.

Homelessness and the need for additional shelter beds in Albany County continue to be a focus for the Capital Area Council of Churches (CACC). It is our belief that all people, regardless of a person's circumstances and behaviors, have a human right to obtain shelter from deadly weather and dangerous street living. Since 2000 the CACC as sponsor and First Lutheran Church of Albany as host have responded to this crisis by providing an Emergency Overflow Shelter with professionally trained staff, operating through the cold weather months, 7 days a week, 12 hours each day.

We encourage everyone to plan now to participate in this event that will help us continue the work of the shelter through the coming winter months. As in the past, the event is open to ALL ages – children, youth and adults! Students from Cornerstone Campus Ministry at the University at Albany will be assisting the planning team with hosting the event. Participants will be encouraged to get pledges and work towards our common goal of raising at least \$10,000 towards the work of the shelter.


