Welcome again to our Healing Ministry. I am continuing the message from last month about the three kings and their travel plans. These Magi's travels were unique and had the hidden meaning of faith and unity. Magi from three different countries and cultures united for the travel as one heart, and one mind; and, they never gave up their travel plans. They reached the place where the Holy Family and the Baby Jesus were. King Caspar gave a gift of gold, which AU is the symbol of. Gold is bright reddish yellow, soft, and dense. Gold was to crown Him as Heavenly King, as well as born in the blood line of King David.

The Magi, Balthazar, gave the gift of frankincense. This is an aromatic resin for perfume from Boswellina trees. Frankincense can even be used today for prayers, incense, and the symbol of Divine. The Holy Baby Jesus is going to be divine, prayer filled, and would dedicate his life for us.

The Magi, Melchior, offered the gift of myrrh. Myrrh is like a gum resin that comes from the thorny tree called the Commiphora genus. It is useful for medicine, incense, and can also be mixed with wine as a drink. Myrrh represents how the Holy Baby Jesus is going to be crowned with a thorny crown and would be used later after the crucifixion and before placing him in a tomb.

The other history says that the gift of gold was stolen by the two thieves who were crucified with our Lord. These magi's were teaching us to focus on our Lord, just like the star in the sky that they followed on their journey. He will lead us in the right direction. Look carefully and search for Him. Many false prophets will come into our journey of life; but, just trust and follow Him. Preparing a gift for him is to surrender to him totally. I would like to share how my tear-filled prayer was answered.

One night, before the Christmas of 2019, I was very burdened because of financial difficulties; and, I accepted the Lord during this very hard time in my life. Though I was born and grew up in a house full of gold, silver, and diamonds, (my parents were another generation in the business of gold, diamond and silver), they refused to offer a part for me because of I took Christ in my life. My husband's family was also very highly educated, had ordained ministers, and rail road officers in their families. But they denied to offer a part because I was not born in a Christian generation. On that particular night, I was kneeling and

crying and said in my prayer, "Lord Jesus, you are my father, you took me out of a family filled with gold and silver. You know our difficulties. I am wondering how the three kings brought the gifts that they needed and gave to Joseph and Mary. Remember me and help me. I obeyed your word; and, I never took any thing from parents. Show me your love and that you will take care of my financial difficulties."





After this prayer, I went to bed and feel asleep. On December 24th, 2019, on Christmas Eve, we went to our older son's home. My daughter-in-law and my son gave a gift and said, "We saw this gift we said this is for my mom." I opened it and became speechless and shocked. It was a rectangular burgundy colored box. The outside words were painted in pure 24 karat gold along with the three kings gift and the picture of them." I opened the box and inside there were three beautiful small wooden jars made by the olive tree. One has



pure 24 Karat gold pieces, the second one has frankincense like a small stones, and the third one had myrrh. I felt that his voice was saying, "Look, I received the same gift and now I am giving it to you."

I was shocked; but, I got the answer from the Lord, Jesus Christ:

- * He is saying to me to receive this gold and I will take care of your finances,
- * Continue your prayers and give it to me just like the frankincense, and
- * Though your difficulties are like the thorny tree, I am in your life just like the myrrh. I took the thorny crown to be with you and save you.

All of my life experiences with the Lord, Jesus Christ, are amazing and miracle filled.

Let us pray: "Loving Lord, God almighty, thank you for the gift of you in our life. Give us the wisdom and knowledge to see the wonders in your word every day. We give all our needs into thy hands. Accept it and help us as needed, and help us to continue to follow our journey with you. Shine upon us just like the star which was guided the three kings to reach you. Give us one heart and one mind to unite our faithful journey and also to reach to you in our lives. Thank you for all your help for us. In your Son's name, Jesus Christ, we are praying. Amen.
