

Let us be strong in our faith and pray to the Healer, Jesus Christ. He will put to an end to this plague and the healing will cover everything and everyone.







Our hours this year are 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm, a change from prior years. Brooks Chicken BBQ made a business decision resulting in fewer on-site hours for our sale. We have chosen these particular hours because in past years our sales have peaked between 3 pm and 5 pm. With fewer hours, we may lose some sales. Even so, we plan to sell 1000 dinners in four hours compared with 1100 dinners in eight hours in recent years. An aggressive sales effort will be needed to alert potential customers about reduced hours yet the same fine dinners. Prices remain the same as last October: \$12 for full dinner, \$9 for chicken only. Our publicity was sent to local news outlets, radio, and television stations in mid-March. Now, it is up to each member to tell friends and strangers alike about the date, the hours, and the quality of our dinners.

Again we need the volunteer efforts of many people. Sign-up sheets will be out April 5. We will need cake bakers, dining room servers, cashiers, traffic control, welcoming ambassadors, and clean-up folks! Think about what you can do best, and then rush for the sign-up sheets before someone else gets your favorite spot! 
