




Welcome everyone to our Healing Ministry...

May the Healer, Jesus Christ, be with you all. We are in the middle of a virus pandemic; and, we are all feeling fear, panic, stress, and worry. Today the shadow of death and grieving are all around the world. Health care workers are working around the clock.

The following are some of the questions from the people of God: "What is the hope for our future; and, when will we be freed from this virus?" In the year 2000, in the Garden of Gethsemane, the disciples of Jesus Christ had the same feelings. They heard from the Lord, "Just as the Father knows me and I know Father, and I lay down my life for the sheep." (John 10:15).



They heard about the persecution of our Lord from him but they kept silent. When they went to the garden of Gethsemane, the Lord Jesus was in agony and stress. He knew how much he was going to suffer for us on the cross to give his life. Today, our world is also facing the same thing; but, our Lord kept his custom of prayer life. (Luke 22:39). 

Note: The Guilderland Council of Ministries was initiated by the Hamilton Union Church [Presbyterian] in Guilderland by a June call to meet in September 1974. In 1976/1977 its name was changed to the Guilderland Interfaith Council after non-Christian groups were invited to participate in events.


