The Lord Jesus wept again while standing in front of a tomb where his friend, Lazarous, was kept. Lazarus' sister, Martha, came where Jesus was and saw him. She knelt at his feet and said, "Lord if you had been here, my brother would hot have died. Jesus saw Mary weeping and all the Jews (John 11:33). The Lord, Jesus Christ, saw their tears deeply moved and a great compassion filled in Him and Jesus began to weep (John 11:34). The faith of Martha and the others touched our Lord and he wept for His believers.

Even today, he is unchanging. Maybe we may not see Jesus, but we can feel His tears in our hearts. The power of His in human lives and so He underscores comfort the significance of Jesus' ultimate victory over death. Let us read His answer for Martha. "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God (John 1140). Then He cried with a loud voice, "Lazarous come out" (John 11:43).

The above scripture gives us assurance that we can trust Him to overcome the present problem even though it may look very big.

I would like to share something with all of you. My husband, George Ezekiel, who is now on 24 hours of oxygen therapy at home, is receiving all his home and nursing care from me, a retired nurse, while being in constant contact with his doctors. During this time, I am also serving our Lord in our church. But for now, my husband's care is like a three-shift day, evenings and nights. But the Lord, Jesus Christ, is with me by his strength. I am doing this because I believe in Him; and, I never stop my early 5:00 am prayers for my church families.

This is my faith in Jesus Christ; and, knowing how much time he spent for us carrying the cross and with all the pain and bleeding. With His matchless love, He allowed his body to have the five nails and be crucified on the cross for us.

By his greatest love and compassion, he will bring total healing from this Coronavirus soon. All around the world his healing power will flow like the Living Water and heal the world.

Let us say this small prayer together. "Lord, Jesus Christ, all our five wounds, your pain, and your death on the cross to comfort us, heal us, and give us perfect health. I am kneeling near your feet and offering my thanks to you. Lord, hear my prayer, have mercy on me and make me lean on your chest. Help me to believe in you in all of my life. I am asking the sweet name of your name, Jesus Christ. Amen, Amen and Amen.

## FINANCIAL CAMPAIGN

## McKownville United Methodists Answer the Call!!

The Finance Team is pleased to announce that despite challenging circumstances, as of May 26th, pledges received have exceeded last year's total, both in terms of the number of pledges and the total dollars pledged. 51 pledges have been submitted, an increase of 2 over last year, and \$190,688 has been pledged, an increase of \$2,432.

In recent years, our annual budget has been roughly \$260,000, and pledges have accounted for about 75% of needed income. This year's pledges illustrate the strong congregational support for the mission and programs of the church, and will facilitate the creation of a budget to carry them forward.

There remain uncertainties about other income sources (building use and the Brooks BBQ) due to potential on-going limitations on gathering and meeting. Please continue to hold the church in you prayers. If you have not yet pledged, it is not too late! Pledges can be mailed to the church office.


