

Welcome everyone, to our Healing Ministry. Praise the Lord, God almighty, for his love and mercy during this pandemic. He is with us now and will continue to protect us and keep us healthy. But when we feel we are facing this alone, Jesus Christ, is neither away from us or silent. From my faith experiences, I would like to say," NO, he is not away from us or silent".



Many people are feeling overwhelmed, stressed, uncomfortable, and tired with so many restrictions placed upon us. When we are facing sickness, many are people push the Lord away. But he is watching over us and sees our tears and hear our prayers. Let us remember, after the Lord, Jesus Christ, was resurrected he appeared before his disciples for 40 days and was then taken up to heaven. And then the persecution of believers and disciples occurred.

Sometimes, we make plans; and then they suddenly change and it effects our thoughts. Let us read from Isaiah 8:9. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts nor are your ways my ways." says the Lord. "So are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."

Sometimes our plans may not be very good, but God's plan will be bring good tidings. Let us continue to read about Saul's journey to Damascus (Act 9:3). It says, "Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him." We read in the four gospels Jesus said in (John 12:46), "Have come as light into the world." As he said, Saul was in the light around him in the presence of the Lord, Jesus Christ. "Then he fell to the ground." (Act 9:4).

Saul was courageous, intellectual, and skilled in art in leather. The light from the heaven may have shocked him; and, now he was under the power of the Lord. The plan of Saul was closed on the road to Damascus. He heard a voice calling him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?." In (Act 9:4) he asked, "Who are you Lord?" In (Act 9:5) the reply came, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting." From this we can understand, as we are believers, we will face persecution or sickness. Our Lord feels our struggles; and, he plans to protect and heal us.

Now, let us bow our heads and pray:

"Lord, God almighty, we love you with all our heart. We are praying for those who are facing persecution on behalf of the Gospel. Lord, Jesus Christ, be with them, protect them, and comfort them. Hold them within your divine arms and heal and bless them. Lord bless us and our families to be with your light of Jesus Christ. We pray in your name. Amen. Amen. Amen."

YOUTH GROUP



Parsonage Committee to begin Fundraising

The parsonage committee is continuing to work on finding a home for the pastor and his family. We have had several meetings to discuss our plan of action and to set a list of priorities with regards to the location, type of home and amenities. We are also working with the bank and realtor. While this is not an easy task, we are making headway. At the time of the Church Conference vote on the parsonage, one of the objectives was to fundraise as much as possible in order to mitigate the cost of the mortgage. Individual donors would have the opportunity to donate towards the parsonage and teams were asked to sponsor at least one fund raiser. Due to Covid-19 and the temporary closing of the church these fund raising plans were postponed. At this time the committee would like to extend the opportunity to individuals and families who would like to give to the parsonage fund to do so. Several people have already committed and/or donated to the fund and we would like to ask for other supporter of this effort to prayerfully consider making a contribution to the parsonage fund. If you are making a cash donation, please note on the donation that it is for the parsonage fund so that the money is accounted for appropriately. Zimbabwe Crisis Has Two Needs...

Life in Zimbabwe today is difficult. United Methodist missions there need assistance right now. You can help with two specific critical needs: a daily prayer and whatever financial help you can spare.

July 2017, Darcianne Leizer and Henry Walter visited missions in Mutare and Mutambara, Zimbabwe. Both places have urgent specific needs. Our team leader was Dr. Sylvia Reimer. She and her husband, both medical doctors, lived in Zimbabwe for several years and worked at Mutambara. She provided background information summarized below.

Persons in Zimbabwe are experiencing an even more difficult time than we in the United States. Last year's growing season was poor, the corn crop is less than optimal, and drought remains. Drought threatens other crops usually grown this time of year. The economy is in tatters; they continue to officially use Zimbabwe currency but many store prices are given in US dollars that are hard to come by. Official inflation rate is 800% for the past year. Gasoline and diesel are very scarce and extremely expensive when available. And Covid has arrived! There seems to be extensive community spread, although due to a lack of testing the numbers do not reflect that. The government instituted a lock-down very early, but that did not restrain citizens returning from neighboring South Africa. The situation in Zimbabwe is forcing rural people to choose between breaking the law and starving.

In Mutare, the Hilltop Church operates an after-school program, Ishe Anesu, for middle school students offering tutoring and a meal These students are from the poorest part of town. Closed for a time by Covid, Ishe has reopened on a modified plan. Right now they are serving as tutors for students who will be writing important exams later this year and are providing a meal for them.

Mutambara has a hospital. Director Dr. Emmanuel Mefor and his wife Florence Mefor, a nurse, spoke to our church April 2017, describing their work for an under-served population. A key program at the hospital provides training, health care, and companionship for expectant mothers in their last month before delivery. But the government has designated Mutambara as a regional Covid hospital, although to date they have seen no recognized cases. Being so designated, they have had to significantly modify day-to-day hospital operation to comply with national guidelines, including reducing the number of waiting mothers. To complicate the situation, government doctors and nurses are on strike protesting having not been paid in months. It is increasingly difficult to provide food for those who are there. The Mefors and their team on site daily feed waiting mothers, help youngsters with disabilities who have been referred for therapy, and assist people in the community known to have no resources.

We recognize that the Covid pandemic has hit many of our members very hard, physically, emotionally, and financially. All of us can pray for these particular missions and for the healing of Zimbabwe as a whole. Additionally if you are able to give a money gift, please do so!

Time is of the essence. PUMPKIN PATCH

As of this writing, we do still have pumpkins ordered for delivery on Thursday, September 24th. We will continue to closely monitor government regulations on group gatherings, church events and agricultural market guidelines prior to opening the patch. But, if we are able to move forward to open the patch this year, extra safety measures will need to be put in place to ensure the safety and health of both our volunteers AND our customers. This will require a more structured volunteer system and advanced training. We will not be able to have spontaneous sign ups or last minute shift vacancies and in prior years as all volunteers must receive advanced training.



McKownville's Pumpkin Patch is a community fundraiser which supports our Mission Scholarship Fund. Providing service from seed to step, the pumpkins provide work to the Navajos who grow them, the independent truckers who transport them, the church who sells them, the community who decorate with them and the Capital City Rescue Mission who received fresh pumpkin pies for Thanksgiving after the sale is over. Our motto "Changing the World, One Pumpkin at a Time" is based upon the premise that the pumpkin passes through many levels of service just to reach the customer, and all proceeds support a mission scholarship fund which enables young missionaries the chance to participate in short term mission opportunities without hindrance of cost. Each and every pumpkin contributes to a little bit of good in the world.

If you are interested in participating in a mission trip once the pandemic has passed, funds are available to offset 70% of the cost of a mission trip if needed.

Our expectation – to volunteer at the Pumpkin Patch, you are expected to sit in the sales tent for your assigned shift (likely 4 hour shifts this year) based upon your availability. Help customers select and price pumpkins. Interact with customers about the project and answer questions about the church programs. We will not be carrying pumpkins to people's car for them or bagging for people so as to limit contact. Limited use of cash as payment – we will be encouraging touchless payment systems and credit card sales.

Please watch for updates on Unloading Day and Training times as we must limit group size for these activities as well.

The more who sign up to help up front and receive training, the safer and easier it will be to continue this program. Please contact Angela Stott as soon as possible.


