As we are accustomed to thinking that "no exceptions" is very restrictive from our worldly point of view, Jesus can open our eyes to just the opposite. When we open our hearts to Jesus, we gain the peace and understanding of "no exceptions" in a way that only Jesus can offer. Jesus loves us all – No exceptions!! Jesus forgives our sins – No exceptions!! Jesus accepts us as we are – No exceptions!! And the list continues.

Looking up to our Lord in all we do will always give us the confidence of His consistency. And we can rest assured that His love for us will never change. While the world around us constantly establishes new

laws and policies, Jesus' Words stand strong, unchanging and will always pass the test of time.

With Jesus in our lives, we will never be alone, He is with us everywhere and at all times. His promise of eternal life with Him is not selective or by chance, it is for every single one of us – No Exceptions!!


JESUS LOVES YOU.*

Let us join together wherever we may be ask God almighty to speak with us through his words. Last month, we read about the journey of Saul to Damascus. Let us see after Saul fell from his horse and he had a conversation with our Lord Jesus Christ. Please read Acts 9:8-12. "Saul got up from the ground though his eyes were open, he could not see nothing, so they led him by hand and brought him into Damascus." The power of God and with a bright light blinds Saul's eyes. 

OUR 21ST ANNUAL PUMPKIN PATCH

The McKownville UMC Pumpkin Patch, now operating its 21st year, has seen it's share of unusual circumstances. We have held this fundraiser through Frankenstorm, swept

snow off the pumpkins, had the pumpkin tent blow up in the air and then collapse in the midst of high winds! We have LOST the pumpkin resupply truck and had it arrive several days late with spoiled pumpkins. We have had a Little Red Hen come visit the patch and find a resting place in amongst the orange globes. We have had a HS Football team unload pumpkins passing them person to person like they were passing a football. And we have had



competitors try to buy us out. But we have also made friends within our community, had children come play in the pumpkin maze every year, and been a feature location for wedding photos, family photos and homecoming photos alike. Our patch and our mission has been featured on TV, inspired others into volunteer mission work, provided funds for scholarships sending volunteers all over the globe. One thing we do know for sure is that *PEOPLE LOVE PUMPKINS!* So even in the midst of a pandemic, as we struggle for ways to safely interact and do business in our communities, the sale of Pumpkins at our Annual Pumpkin Patch WILL CONTINUE!

We are taking precautions to keep both our volunteers and our customers safe and healthy. We look forward to sharing the colors of the season with our neighbors. And from seed to sale we are Changing the World – One Pumpkin at a Time!

Here is what you can expect this year:

Volunteers will need to sign up in advance and go through safety training prior to working at the patch. I have advice from Pumpkin Patch Fundraisers Inc and from NYS Department of Agriculture, as well as Albany County DOH regarding how to safely operate this year. I will have a written plan to have available should DOH question our procedures and I will keep that available in the office during the month while the patch is open.

The sale will operate its usual hours as of right now M-F 11a-7p; Saturdays 10a-7p and Sundays 12-6 through October 31st but *hours may vary due to COVID-19 restrictions and the availability of volunteers.

I can work with customers who reach out for large pumpkin orders based upon availability of what they are asking for. Please get their contact info and email me to work out a price and delivery.

Prices are set by size not by weight and are determined by PPF. I cannot quote prices or sizes until they arrive.

We are getting one truck – no replenishment mid - month. So customers should come early in the month for the best selection. Pumpkins will not be any fresher for Halloween if they wait until later in the month.

Our regular Fall Brooks Chicken BBQ will happen on schedule. In these unusual times we needed a new plan. We have a new plan. **Some changes as listed below:**

1st: Drive-in pickup only; no dining room service.

2nd: Whole dinner the only option. Sorry, no "chicken only".

3rd: Brooks will provide the entire meal (chicken, baked potato, cole slaw, roll, cookie, bottle of water). Brooks will package the meal in our upstairs social hall. We collect the money and deliver dinners to customers who stay in their vehicles.

4th: Traffic control! Customer cares will come down the driveway, go all the way down hill, turn right, go across the back of the parking lot, turn right again, come up past the recycle containers to the Memory Garden. A salesperson will take the order, collect money, return change and tickets. The car will then drive to the steps nearest Dunkin' and pick up dinners in exchange for tickets. Cars will leave to Western Avenue at the traffic light. This is a tentative plan and may change. Be alert when you arrive. There will be signs.

Challenge: Changes bring challenges! We have committed to selling 1000 dinners. Our plan is to start selling at 1pm and to sell out. The sooner we sell out, the sooner we go home! Recent BBQ sales by other local organizations show demand for Brooks BBQ is high this Fall.

Needs: Our most important need is for each member of McKownville Church to tell a friend or neighbor about our sale. We are contacting our usual network of persons who can post a notice, but the personal touch is most effective. The more who know, the quicker we sell out.

Helpers: Our new plan requires a different mix of volunteer labor. Expect a call. There is no food preparation but we need "runners" to carry the dinners from social hall to west vestibule and west vestibule to cars. Task training is planned.

Masks: If you help with the BBQ, please respect the Covid-19. It can do us woe. All helpers must wear an suitable mask and must maintain appropriate social distance.


