



Giving...

Our budget is funded by several sources. The largest by far is giving pledged by individuals and families. Next is unpledged giving. Smaller sources are unidentified cash in the offering plates, rental of our building, and fund raisers. We are one third of the way through our fiscal year. From July through October we received \$59,911 from pledging families; our budget anticipated about \$63,250. Thus, giving has been short of expected by a little more than three thousand dollars. Unpledged giving for these months was estimated at \$6,500 based on last year's experience. To date we have received \$4,340, about \$2,200 less than expected. Building use has been non-existent for six months, resulting in little income. One bright spot was our Brooks Chicken BBQ which raised over \$5,000. In summary, we are a little behind in receipts. The Finance Team encourages each pledger to bring their giving up to the pledged amount. Thank you.

On-Line Giving...

A number of families in our congregation contribute through our website. It has come to our attention that some, but not all, families that contribute in this manner have experienced difficulty in recent weeks. The system seems not to recognize the email address or password. It then prevents a donation. Our servicing company recently acknowledged that the problem is known to them. It is a result of changes they are making to their system. The problem should be solved in a few weeks. If you have experienced such a problem, please be patient and try again in a week or so. REPORT ON THE 4TH ANNUAL JOHN U. MILLER MEMORIAL CROP WALK

On a beautiful, sunny Sunday afternoon, on May 3, 2020, over 150 walkers participated in the first ever *virtual* CROP WALK. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, this was the only way to continue the nearly 40 year tradition of raising money for local and global hunger relief. (It is worth noting that this was the first time in five years it was actually a wonderful day for a walk!).

Not surprisingly, we didn't do quite as well as last year, but we did extremely well under the circumstances. Last year, we raised &96,022.00; this year we raised \$90,631.45. Of these amounts, \$28,005.50 and \$22,735.00 respectively were donated to 26 local food pantries and soup kitchens. McKownville United Methodist Church raised about \$1,000.00 toward this effort this year, compared to \$1,805.00 last year. As to the total number of walkers, last year there were 275 brave souls.

But, this effort is not about money; it's about people starving!!! Starving people right next door, not just around the world!!! It's about poverty in the midst of plenty. It's about following the essence of the Gospel of Jesus Christ—who, not just preach, love and compassion! It's a humanitarian effort, meaning it is not limited to Christian churches. People of all faiths and traditions working together to solve a huma problem. "There is one God, and Father of us all" means we are all brothers and sisters. Put another way, we are all in this together. In the famous parable of the Sheep and the Goats, Jesus says (Matthew 25:40) "Whatsoever ye do to the least of these My brethren, ye do also to Me."

The next CROP walk will be held (live if possible; "virtually" if necessary) on May 2, 2021. I will continue as team captain to recruit walkers, gather sponsors, and provide communications on the event. If you need more information, please feel free to contact me. (My information is in the directory). See you next spring for a, hopefully, more successful walk for hunger!

Emergency Overflow Homeless Shelter Dinners

I hope you are staying safe and virus free. I know many people are cooking a lot more than they did in the past, so maybe you would like to sign up to make a full meal for 15 homeless individuals for the Capital District Area Council of Churches' Homeless Shelter, or maybe to make just a soup, stew or a dessert that would feed 15 that you would like to donate towards a full meal prepared by others?

This shelter is operated in the belief that a ministry of hospitality and sanctuary is a mission of the Christian Church that scripture compels us to welcome and minister to the most vulnerable and needy in our society. This is illustrated by many bible stories including the Good Samaritan. Due to COVID restrictions, this shelter can only house 15 men this year and the McKownville United Methodist Church has committed to providing meals the second and fourth Mondays of November through April. The Shelter is located at the **First Lutheran Church at <u>626 State Street</u>**, **Albany**. To get there, turn onto Cortland Place from Western Avenue and State Street is your first left. The church is on the left and the first entrance is for the First Lutheran Church and the second entrance is for the Shelter.

Meals should be dropped off between 6-6:30 p.m. at the Shelter entrance by placing the dinner on the small table at the entrance. Move at least 6 feet from the door and call the shelter at 518-426-1227 to tell them you have arrived. Shelter staff will come up and collect your meal. If you are unable to bring your dinner in the evening, please call Julie (the First Lutheran Church office manager) a few days in advance at 518-463-1326 to schedule a drop-off time when the church is open. Please remember to wear a mask.

Meals should serve 15 people and **should not include pork**. Meals should include an entrée, vegetables and dessert. Salad, bread and butter, and beverage mixes are optional. Salads should serve only 7, as they do not keep well. No need to provide salad dressing. Beverages are a nice addition and they would prefer a drink mix — lemonade, fruit punch, etc. for storage purposes. Please don't send carbonated drinks.

Meals must be delivered in containers you do not expect to have returned. The shelter suggests stews, casseroles, meatloaf, pasta, meat and gravy, roasted chicken, shepherd's pie, and chilis. Any meal you are able to prepare is welcome as this may be the only meal the guests will have that day. Thank you for taking on this very important ministry.

The laity portion of the 11th session of Upper New York Annual Conference was held virtually on October 2, 2020, while the clergy portion of the conference was live on October 2, 2020. I will offer a brief summary of some of the highlights of the entire conference.

As Bishop Mark J. Webb was unavailable, Bishop John School of the Greater New Jersey Episcopal Area presided remotely; other presenters and leaders were gathered in person at the United Methodist Center in Liverpool to lead the clergy

portion of this annual conference.

One item of particular importance was an update to the Child Victims Act as reported by the Conference Board of Trustees. The update "removed the statue of limitations on survivors of childhood sexual abuse and has put some churches in the Upper New York Conference in a position where they may be liable for horrific deeds of childhood sexual abuse that took place decades ago." (Quote was from the full report of the conference available on the Conference website).

Sadly, another item of importance was that 11 churches in the Upper New York Annual Conference were closed. This fact was highlighted by a number of statistics related to membership and attendance:

Membership stands at 140,544—a decrease of 3,823 from 2018
Worship attendance stands at 39,127—a decrease of 1,317 from 2018
Church school attendance stands at 10,247—a decrease of 205 from 2018
Professions or reaffirmations of faith totaled 1,206—a decrease of 171 from 2018
Adults and young adults in small groups totaled 15,995—a decrease of 845 from 2018

Worshipers engaged in mission totaled 14,239—an INCREASE of 1869 from 2018

The trustees also explained that New York State requires that trustees be elected by written ballot only; a "virtual" session cannot elect trustees for a full term. The Book of Discipline does allow the Bishop and Cabinet, upon recommendation from the Nominating Committee, to fill vacancies "ad interim" (between sessions of Annual Conference). This means that the three people nominated for these positions will only serve until the next Annual Conference in June 2021. At that time, trustees will be elected via written ballot.
