

<i>McKownville United Methodist Church is changing its fiscal year from the current July- June pattern to a calendar year. This change will be effective January 1, 2021.</i> It makes our fiscal year consistent with that of the Albany District and the Upper New York Confer- ence. This change does not affect the giving report you will receive from the financial secre- tary. For calendar year 2020 you will receive two pages, one reporting your giving from Janu- ary 1 to June 30, 2020 and one reporting your giving from July 1 to December 31, 2020. In fu- ture years you will receive a single statement for the entire year, January 1 to December 31.					
This change was urged by Rev Debbie Earthrowl, Albany District Superintendent, discussed by the Finance Team, presented to Leadership Council in November, and approved unanimously by Leadership Council. Working out details was left to the Finance Team.					
Each year our church must report to the Conference certain information regarding our programs and monies. To meet Conference practices now, our volunteer leaders must compile infor- mation from two different fiscal years to prepare reports. This change will make reporting easier. It will also impact how we schedule our budget process and our annual financial cam- paign.					
For this to become a reality, the twelve month budget July 2020 – June 2021 approved by Leadership Council June 2020 will be extended another six months. Budgeted values for the added six months (July 1 through December 31, 2021) will be half those of the current budg- et. Some adjustments will be made for known reasons (for example, Ministry Shares will in- crease slightly in 2021). Details of this updated 2021 budget will be announced in January and presented to Leadership Council for approval.					
This action has only one major impact on members. Because we are extending the current fiscal year by six months, we are asking members to extend their current pledge for another six months. Later this month each member and friend will receive a letter asking for support of this extension.					
Prior to receiving that letter, do these two things. First pray for our church, for its presence on Western Avenue, and for its ministry in Guilderland. Second, reflect on the blessings you enjoy from God, even in these strange and stressful times, and the need to maintain our faithful presence right here. Ponder prayerfully what your response will be to this request. Be ready to respond when the letter arrives.					
In future years, the annual financial campaign for the coming calendar year will be conducted in September-October. Using pledge information and cost information from Trustees and pro- gram leaders, the Finance Team will finalize a budget for presentation in December to Leader- ship Council for approval.					



I hope you are staying safe and virus free. I know many people are cooking a lot more than they did in the past, so maybe you would like to sign up to make a full meal for 15 homeless individuals for the Capital District Area Council of Churches' Homeless Shelter, or maybe to make just a soup, stew or a dessert that would feed 15 that you would like to donate to-wards a full meal prepared by others?

This shelter is operated in the belief that a ministry of hospitality and sanctuary is a mission of the Christian Church that scripture compels us to welcome and minister to the most vulnerable and needy in our society. This is illustrated by many bible stories including the Good Samaritan. Due to COVID restrictions, this shelter can only house 15 men this year and the McKownville United Methodist Church has committed to providing meals the second and fourth Mondays of November through April. The Shelter is located at the **First Luther-an Church at 626 State Street, Albany**. To get there, turn onto Cortland Place from Western Avenue and State Street is your first left. The church is on the left and the first entrance is for the First Lutheran Church and the second entrance is for the Shelter.

Meals should be dropped off between 6-6:30 p.m. at the Shelter entrance by placing the dinner on the small table at the entrance. Move at least 6 feet from the door and call the shelter at 518-426-1227 to tell them you have arrived. Shelter staff will come up and collect your meal. If you are unable to bring your dinner in the evening, please call Julie (the First Lutheran Church office manager) a few days in advance at 518-463-1326 to schedule a drop-off time when the church is open. Please remember to wear a mask.

Meals should serve 15 people and **should not include pork**. Meals should include an entrée, vegetables and dessert. Salad, bread and butter, and beverage mixes are optional. Salads should serve only 7, as they do not keep well. No need to provide salad dressing. Beverages are a nice addition and they would prefer a drink mix — lemonade, fruit punch, etc. for storage purposes. Please don't send carbonated drinks.

Meals must be delivered in containers you do not expect to have returned. The shelter suggests stews, casseroles, meatloaf, pasta, meat and gravy, roasted chicken, shepherd's pie, and chilis. Any meal you are able to prepare is welcome as this may be the only meal the guests will have that day. Thank you for taking on this very important
