


YOUTH GROUP



SENSE OF DIRECTION



Sense of direction, that instinctive or intuitive feeling of knowing which direction you're headed, or which way to go at an intersection without the use of navigation system. Some (many!) years ago when I was early on in my career, I had to travel to a coastal port to oversee the loading of a cargo ship. My job was to inspect the hold of the ship, which was six stories down below the main deck. The hold was enormous and as I walked around with a flashlight in near total darkness, I suddenly realized everything looked the same and I had no idea how to get back to the exit ladder. In a moment of panic, I stopped and looked around in

every direction, which did not help at all. The more rational side of my mind finally kicked back in gear, and I looked up to find the light that was shining through the small passageway far above me that I initially descended through. Once I saw that, I relaxed and made my way over toward the exit.

I think back now on that experience and wonder just how many other times I've found myself in a similar situation. And I would guess that many of us can attest to the same. Maybe we haven't found ourselves in the hold of a cargo ship, but let's stop and think for a moment – How many times have we gotten confused and lost perspective? Perhaps with our thoughts, our careers, our relationships, and many other aspects of our lives?? And when we look around us, we can't see a path that will lead us to a better spot? But again, thinking back to my near panic moment in that ship, the answer was to "stop, look up and find the light," which immediately calmed me down and led me to where I needed to go.

And so it is with our lives and with all the times we lose our sense of direction. Looking around us seldom brings us peace and the direction we need to go, BUT, looking up to the Lord, and seeing His Light shine always provides us with the inner peace and comfort, knowing that He is there, always looking over us, and pointing us in the direction we need to go for safety, freedom, and the peace of mind that only

He can provide.

We just can't find our "way out" without the Light of the Lord. We can search for hours, days or even years looking around us, but just like being in the bottom of that ship, we can wander in darkness and make little to no progress. It takes our Faith in Jesus to stop and look up and pray for His guidance; knowing that the Light from above will always be there to guide our paths and remain constant in our lives. His Light is the compass we need to take our next steps in the right direction.

Rely on Jesus, the Light from above, it's the only way to find our Way!

UMCOR



The Upper New York (UNY) Mission Central HUB is preparing for the coming spring to support survivors affected by the different disasters (floods and high winds) that may have impacted our area. In partnering with the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), UNY's status of kits on hand is low at best. The most requested items are cleaning and hygiene kits. Those who can JMCOR support our communities by assembling kits in your homes or churches, please share projects so we can support your efforts and

possibly share your methods with others. This event will take place between the months of April and May 2021. Any number of kits will help.

Please review the list for contents of each kit. If you cannot provide complete kits, we can use individual items to help complete other kits that arrive incomplete. https://www.unyumc.org/mission/umcor-supply-list.

The Mission Central HUB is still closed; but, if items are delivered to the church, a member of the Outreach Team will make sure the kits get to the HUB.

Hygiene Kit List



- One hand towel (15x25— 17x27" and no kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels)
- One wash cloth (no kitchen; cleaning; or microfiber towels)
- One comb (must be sturdy with at least 6" of teeth; no pocket combs or picks; and rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6" of teeth)
- One toenail or fingernail clipper (no emery boards or metal nail files)
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger and no Ivory or Jergen's soap—do not remove packaging)
- One adult tooth brush (do not remove from packaging and personal advertising not acceptable.
- Ten adhesive bandages (3/4x3" and common household bandages acceptable).
- One one-gallon size of resealable bags

Cleaning Kit List

- One five-gallon round bucket with lid (14.35"h x 12.19"d x 12.19"d; no screw lids; may be used but cleaned; and advertise-
- ment is acceptable.)
- One 32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner and no spray cleaners)
- One 16-34 oz. bottle liquid dish soap
- One 4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener
- One 6-14 oz. pump spray insect repellent (must have protective covers and a pack of 10-20 wipes is also acceptable)
- One scrub brush (with or without handle)
- 18 re-usable cleaning wipes (no terry cloth, microfiber or paper towels and remove from packaging)
- Five scouring pads (no stainless steel or pads with soap in them and remove from packaging)
- 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic)
- 24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45 gallon size and remove from packaging)
- Five N95 particulate respirator dust masks (1-3 mm thickness and no surgical masks)

The United Methodist Church celebrates, during the church year, special Sundays that illustrate the nature and calling of the Church. These special Sundays, approved by General Conference, are the only Sundays of church-wide emphasis. The special Sundays are placed on the calendar in the context of the Christian year, so as to make clear the calling of the Church as the people of God. Several of these give persons an opportunity to contribute to special programs.

Dates of Church-wide Offerings (indicated by asterisks) are set by General Conference. These offerings do deeds expressive of our Christian commitment. Annual Conferences may also determine other Special Sundays with or without offerings.

(These special Sundays do not take precedence over particular days in the Christian year.)

To make a contribution to any of these causes, write a check to "McKownville U M C" and on the memo line write the name of the cause you wish to support. It is helpful to the tellers if you write separate checks for a special cause and for your regular church offering. Place your special offering in the collection plate. Your designation will be noted by the Financial Secretary on your annual statement of giving. For some of these special offerings there may be designated envelopes on a rack in the back of the sanctuary. Ask an usher. For details, check the website of the United Methodist Church, special Sundays.

In addition to these denominational special offerings, McKownville Church has a special connection with Mutambara Mission Hospital in Zimbabwe. Dr. Emmanuel Mefor directs the hospital; his wife Florence Mefor is a nurse. The hospital has an eye clinic and a residential unit for expecting mothers so they learn skills needed to care for their infant. There is an associated school K-12 nearby. July 2017 two members of our church were part of a team to Mutambara to help with expecting mothers and to paint part of the school. To support the hospital, write "Advance #3022286" on the memo line; to support Dr. Mefor, write "UMC Missionaries #13990Z" on the memo line; to support Mrs. Mefor, write "UMC Missionaries #13991Z".

These special offerings are above and beyond your regular giving. Your regular giving supports our pastor, staff, educational program, senior ministries, outreach, and physical plant.



A great big thank-you to everyone who was able to attend the Church Conference on April 25th. The Church Conference was comprised of live attendees and people zooming in. This was our first attempt at a hybrid meeting, but it worked well. Thanks for your patience as we worked through the process. The motion that was presented was to approve the purchase of 12 Ableman Ave and the vote passed 33-3. The committee will now meet to address all the actual costs associated with the anticipated construction and work with the contractor. Once a full financial plan is developed, a charge conference will be held to vote on the financing portion of the purchase. Again, thank you all for your continued prayer and support for this project.


