PRAYER CHAIN





Welcome everyone to our Ministry of Healing. Praise the Lord, for keeping us safe every day. So many things have been going on in the world during the month of August. We are watching the news and seeing so many people are trying to move from one country to another. It is not easy; and, it looks very challenging every day. Some families are separated including children from their parents. It is a tearful experience. There was a 9 year old girl last evening who didn't know where to go. She started to walk, she saw an orphanage, and she went in. The Pastor who owns the



orphanage welcomed her and accepted her to live in his orphanage. Though she is in a safe place with love and ca, she is missing her parents. She went to the garden of the orphanage and sang a gospel song which was taught by her mother. "When My Tears Will be Over, When my Sorrow will be Over, My Redeemer Jesus Christ come soon and help me."

Just like this little girl, two women were in great sorrow moving from another country to their home country. They both lost their husbands and all their belongings. They had to start their lives fresh in their home country. One woman was a mother in law and the other woman was her daughter in law. Their story took place during the period of Judges in our Bible. There were dark days of Israel. Judge 17:6, "In those days Israel had no King everyone did as they saw fit." But some who followed True God. The two women were Naomi and Ruth. Their experiences are beautiful with loyalty, friendship, commitment to God, understanding each other, and respecting each other.

Naomi and Ruth were not of the same religion. Naomi worshipped the God of Israel and Ruth did not. Their cultures, ages, and family background were very different. They were in deep sorrow, but they clicked with each other with great affection. In our world, sometimes we may hear some daughter in law's say, "Let me tell you about my mother in law." It may sometimes be negative, humorous, complaining, angry, upsetting, or ridiculing. These two women are teaching the present world about the relationships between a mother in law and a daughter in law. They are also showing the meaning of their titles, true relationships, how to be a peace maker, and also be a role model for others.

In the period of the ancient world, widows are ignored ones. There was nothing worse than being a widow. They were poor, helpless, and lived with a sorrowful life. Naomi had a plan to leave Moab and go to Bethlehem to start a fresh life. She told her daughter-in-law, Ruth, "Return to your home, and have a new life." (Ruth 1:11-13). But Ruth was a Moabites, but after

she married Naomi's son, she started to worship the true God. And God of Israel accepted her as his believer. Ruth belonged to a race that was not accepted by the Israelites. Ruth said to her mother in law, "Don't urge me to leave you or turn back from you. Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God where you die, I will die, and there will be buried. May the Lord deal with me, be ever so severely. if anything but death separates you and me." (Ruth 1:16-17).

But God of the Israelites accepted Ruth, regardless of her race, sex or nationality. Ruth is the perfect example for God 's impartiality. In later years, she become the great grandmother of King David and direct ancestor of Christ. Ruth did not allowed her bitterness and disappointment to destroy her opportunities. She never sat at home waiting for her opportunities. She took initiative. and she went to work in the field. When the wheat and barley were in harvest, the worker would cut down the stalk and bundle it. Some of the grains were drooped on the field. As per the scriptures, (Leviticus 19:9), "When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather gleaning of your harvest." Leave the edges of the field unharvested to provide food for the poor, alien, and other travelers. Ruth worked to collect the grain from the edge of the field along with any grain that dropped on the field. It was hard work for Ruth, but God provided strength to her.

If some one is waiting for an opportunity, don't wait. Just ask God to lead you to the opportunity. Ruth put her faith in God, hard work, service to her mother-in–law, and family with love and bravery. The relationship between Nami and Ruth was a great bond and had faith in God.

This mother in law and daughter relationship had a strong mutual commitment. Nami allowed to see her daughter in law's joy. As a mother-in-law and daughter-n-in law, they probably had tension, stress, and anger, but, they were bound each other. Ruth's love for her mother-in-law was great in the site of the town of Bethlehem people also.

Ruth was unaware of the plans and purpose for her life from God. Ruth was blessed to be a part of King David and the Messiah. We must make our plans and choices with God. Each of us had parents, older friends, or relatives looking out for our interest. How often are we going to? As we do our daily work, let us allow God also to work with us, just like he did in Ruth's life. Amen.

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 2, 2021 — 11:30am to 3:30pm FULL DINNER TO GO — \$13 (ONLY OPTION) Half Chicken, Baked Potato, Cole Slaw, Roll, Cookie, & Bottle of Water

Our Fall Brooks Chicken BBQ will happen in just four weeks! Here is the plan.....

1st. Drive-in pickup only - no dining room service.

2nd: Whole dinners are the only option. Sorry, no "chicken only".

3rd: Brooks will provide the entire meal and bring grilled food to our upstairs social hall.

4th: Traffic control!: Customers drive down to far end of parking lot and circle around to the Memory Garden. Salespersons take an order, collect money, return change and tickets. Cars drive up to the steps by west vestibule and exchange tickets for dinners.

Cars leave to Western Avenue at the traffic light.

<u>McKownville Church Helpers</u>: Will sell tickets, package the dinners, move dinners from social hall to west entrance, and deliver dinners and bottled water to customers who stay in their vehicles. With enough helpers, we can staff two shifts of two hours each.

Challenge:

- We plan to sell 1,000 dinners. As Brooks delivers dinners to us, we rush them to waiting customers
- Need #1: Each McKownville Church member tell a friend/neighbor about our sale.
- Need #2: Helpers! Minimum below; extra help always appreciated. For each shift:

At least 6 persons to put chicken, potato, roll, and slaw into box.

At least 6 runners to move dinners from social hall to west vestibule.

At least 2 people to bag the assembled dinners.

At least 4 delivery people to take dinner bags from west vestibule to cars.

At least 1 person for traffic control and

At least 4 people to sell tickets, and as many as are able for clean up.

The United Methodist Church celebrates, during the church year, special Sundays that illustrate the nature and calling of the Church. These special Sundays, approved by General Conference, are the only Sundays of church-wide emphasis. The special Sundays are placed on the calendar in the context of the Christian year, so as to make clear the calling of the Church as the people of God. Several of these give persons an opportunity to contribute to special programs.

Dates of Church-wide Offerings (indicated by asterisks) are set by General Conference. These offerings do deeds expressive of our Christian commitment. Annual Conferences may also determine other Special Sundays with or without offerings.

(These special Sundays do not take precedence over particular days in the Christian year.)

To make a contribution to any of these causes, write a check to "McKownville U M C" and on the memo line write the name of the cause you wish to support. It is helpful to the tellers if you write separate checks for a special cause and for your regular church offering. Place your special offering in the collection plate. Your designation will be noted by the Financial Secretary on your annual statement of giving. For some of these special offerings there may be designated envelopes on a rack in the back of the sanctuary. Ask an usher. For details, check the website of the United Methodist Church, special Sundays.

In addition to these denominational special offerings, McKownville Church has a special connection with Mutambara Mission Hospital in Zimbabwe. Dr. Emmanuel Mefor directs the hospital; his wife Florence Mefor is a nurse. The hospital has an eye clinic and a residential unit for expecting mothers so they learn skills needed to care for their infant. There is an associated school K-12 nearby. July 2017 two members of our church were part of a team to Mutambara to help with expecting mothers and to paint part of the school. To support the hospital, write "Advance #3022286" on the memo line; to support Dr. Mefor, write "UMC Missionaries #13990Z" on the memo line; to support Mrs. Mefor, write "UMC Missionaries #13991Z".

These special offerings are above and beyond your regular giving. Your regular giving supports our pastor, staff, educational program, senior ministries, outreach, and physical plant.

Our Nursery



A nursery for the children at McKownville was included in a new sanctuary and educational wing, with church offices & classrooms, that were constructed 1959/1960. (Contracts were signed in July 1959 and the new complex was consecrated on October 30, 1960.) This nursery for infants up to two years age (or kindergarten if no other SS program) prospered for many years. Noah's Ark was painted on a back wall by Norman Swanson.

The May 2004 annual report noted: "We are blessed to have Regina Riley and Carmita Becker as Child Care Providers. The nursery is a very busy place year-round and offers a high-quality program implemented with an unusual level of commitment from these teachers." Katia replaced Carmita the next year.





In 2011 the nursery staff and policies became the responsibility of the Staff, Pastor, and Parish relations team. The Christian Education team continued to fund and oversee programs for both nursery and preschool and older children.

By the 2010's numbers of children in the nursery had greatly dwindled, yet there were two paid professionals, as more than one adult present is one of the Safe Sanctuaries policies. In 2017 it was reported: "Numbers vary, and many weeks we do not have any infants/toddlers in the nursery."

New to Planned Giving? Here's Where You Begin.

What are three most popular types of planned gifts?

- Beneficiary Designation—You can designate your church as the beneficiary to an insurance policy, bank account, brokerage account, or retirement plan. This gift is simple to give and easy to arrange. It usually just requires the donor to sign a beneficiary designation form provided by the plan or account administrator.
- 2. Bequests—A bequest is a gift made through a will or living trust. There is no cost to the donor during their lifetime and is revocable. It only requires a simple codicil if the donor has an existing will or trust. Sample bequest language is available.
- 3. Blended Gift—This is a combination of an immediate and planned gifts.
