John the Apostle 85 AD — 90 AD 2 John 1:13; 2 John 1:4;2 John 1:3

Welcome everyone to our Ministry of Healing. Praise God for his mercy and grace keeping us all safe. Every new day is a gift

from God. Our health is also a gift from God, the Healer. But there people sick and searching for sources for healing. Today, there are so many products available but are they true or false? We must be careful before purchasing them. Healing is free and available from the Lord, Jesus Christ. John the apostle, sent mail to a family member. He wrote this letter maybe between 85 AD-90 AD. He wrote many unique letters and were filled with the love of God. He is an apostle of love. Love means putting others first and not being selfish. John is an eye witness to our Lord. He was a beloved disciple for him. Apostle John's 2nd letter was sent to a chosen lady and her children who lived in Ephesus. Please read this small letter in (2 John 1-13). The house located at 12 Ableman Avenue, Albany was purchased on August 24, 2021 for \$195,000. In addition the church paid \$1,165.00 for Title Insurance, and \$357.00 in filing fees, for a total cost of \$196,522. As you may recall, the search for a parsonage began in March of 2019 and at that time, the search Committee was approved to find a house at a cost of up to \$300,000, based on an analysis of the real estate market at that time. Once 12 Ableman was identified as a possible purchase, the Committee spoke with two different construction contractors and we were given a quote of \$63,000 to construct an addition on the property to add a handicap accessible bathroom and laundry facilities on the first floor, in accordance with conference standards. Based on this quote, on April 25, 2021, a special church conference was held and a motion "To approve the purchase and renovation of 12 Ableman Avenue, Albany, NY as a parsonage at a cost of up to \$300,000" was passed.

In support of that motion, the Parsonage Committee had stated that the Church would obtain a mortgage/loan for up to \$200,000 and the remainder of the funds needed would be obtained through donations/fundraisers. That commitment remains unchanged.

Following that vote, the contractors we had previously been in contact with advised that construction prices had greatly increased and they now had other projects on their schedules, so could no longer work for us. After much research and effort, the Trustees finally found a construction firm who could fit our project into their fall 2021 schedule. Because of the impacts of COVID-19 on the construction industry, the quote has increased significantly

The Trustees have made every effort to limit the cost of the purchase and renovations to under \$300,000, and in fact, although the prices of houses in the area have greatly increased, we were able to purchase the property at a cost that is approximately \$40,000 less than the market rate. Unfortunately, due to COVID, and the increased cost of materials, several of the modifications we had planned for the house may have to wait until after the main construction, making the parsonage meet conference standards, are com-



plete. The trustees are not in favor of waiting as it would be more cost effective and less intrusive on Pastor Jeff and his family if we could complete these modifications during the construction this fall. This would allow us to complete all the renovations and modifications needed to provide the Pastor and his family not only with a home that meets conference standards, but also one that is welcoming and timeless for years to come.

The Trustees have received a pledge of \$10,000 towards these increased costs and we are hopeful that another \$17,000 will be donated from the congregation, so that we can perform all of the renovations needed prior to the Pastor and his family moving into the Parsonage later this year. We are also in need of a washer and dryer in working condition, and would accept a used set, if anyone is thinking about upgrading their current appliances before the end of the year. Please reach out to any of the Trustees if you are able or willing to contribute (again or for the first time) to the parsonage renovation project.

## **FINANCES**

The Finance Team is charged with presenting a budget to Leadership Council in November each year. An important part of preparing a responsible budget is ascertaining how much financial support will be given by members and friends of the congregation. To learn this, we conduct an annual Financial Campaign asking how much they are likely to give to our church next year. For calendar 2022, the campaign begins with a letter.

Each member and contributing friend will receive a letter late September asking for two things: to consider the sum of all the blessings you are receiving from God and to respond to God's generosity by pledging support for next year. Enclosed with the letter is a pledge card and a return envelope. After prayerful consideration, please indicate on the pledge card the amount per week (or month or year) that you are planning to give next year. Place the pledge card in the return envelope (it will go directly to the Financial Secretary) and either mail it to the church office or bring it with you to church on Commitment Sunday October 24. During worship on Commitment Sunday our collective pledges will be dedicated.

Not all members pledge. This year, so far, 84 persons have given toward our church budget. Of these, 61 individuals or families made a pledge; the other 23 persons chose not to pledge but still are donating. We thank all who have given. Pledging helps remove some uncertainty of planning.

Some financial data from 2021 may be of interest. Giving so far this year lags pledging. Of the 61 persons who pledged, 33 are behind by a collective \$15,737. Nine persons are current with their pledge. And 19 are ahead of pledge by a collective \$5,709.

Diligence in giving is also lagging. Year to date giving through the end of August (2/3 of the year), has been incomplete. Of those who made a pledge for 2021, 6 have paid nothing, 10 have paid from something up to half, 21 have paid half to three-quarters, 18 have paid in full for the year, and 6 have paid more than pledged for the year. A great "thank you" to those who are current or ahead of pledge. If you are behind in your giving, please become current.

We have two major fund-raising activities during the year – our Brooks Chicken BBQ. Our May BBQ earned us \$3707. Our October BBQ is imminent. Our goal is to realize \$4000 clear on that event. It is helpful to the tellers if you write separate checks for a special cause and for your regular church offering. Place your special offering in the collection plate. Your designation will be noted by the Financial Secretary on your annual statement of giving. For some of these special offerings there may be designated envelopes on a rack in the back of the sanctuary. Ask an usher. In addition to these denominational special offerings, McKownville Church has a special connection with Mutambara Mission Hospital in Zimbabwe. Dr. Emmanuel Mefor directs the hospital; his wife Florence Mefor is a nurse. The hospital has an eye clinic and a residential unit for expecting mothers so they learn skills needed to care for their infant. There is an associated school K-12 nearby. July 2017 two members of our church were part of a team to Mutambara to help with expecting mothers and to paint part of the school. These special offerings are above and beyond your regular giving. Your regular giving supports our pastor, staff, educational program, senior ministries, outreach, and physical plant.

## Rev. Charles Warner and the 1958 - 1960 McKownville Church Buildings



Rev. Charles Jacob Warner was pastor of McKownville Methodist Church from mid-1956 through the 1964/1965 appointment year. Charles & Rose's children were Cynthia Jean, Nancy Lynn (pictured), and later son Mark Charles. Mark (seen on the left) donated in 2021 to McKownville UMC some of his father's slides.

When Rev. Warner came to McKownville, even with use of a refurbished apartment house (former chicken coop) on newly purchased land, there were double shifts for both Sunday worship services and Sunday school – and still overcrowding. In January 1958 the 23-acre plot of land was fully paid

off, permitting construction on it. Contracts were signed in July 1959 for a "new sanctuary and classroom addition" (with offices) and on October 30, 1960 the new complex was dedicated.



Below are Warner pictures of the 1898 church, the SS annex showing behind the new sanctuary framework (with two Warner girls to the right), & work on the new sanctuary and education wing.


