# NOT A CHANCE!!

Well, those words can certainly be disheartening. I recall hearing them as a teenager when I would occasionally ask to go an event that I was far too young to attend. Or hearing a teacher bluntly explain future opportunities, or the lack of, to the class when we needed to shape up! The same can be said for sports teams, career promotions, and may other areas of life. Sometimes the response is accurate, and sometimes it's a motivator to drive us beyond our perceived limitations. But let's face it, it's never fun to hear the words, "Not a chance!"

NOT A CHANCE!!
NO WAY!!
NO HOW!!

As believers in Jesus, we can look at those words and interpret them so differently than the typical earthly meaning. With God, His actions and predictions are always accurate, 100%, never the slightest possibility that things won't turn out exactly as He has planned. With God we don't deal with "chances," we deal with His Word and absolute truth and confidence that what He says is true. He speaks to us through His Word in the Bible, and through His Son's stay earthly stay with us in human form.

As we reflect, especially during this time of year, and think about the miracle of Jesus's birth, death and resurrection, there are so many events and "what ifs" that could have easily changed the direction of the world. What if Joseph decided to leave Mary when he realized she was going to have a baby? What if King Herod had discovered where Jesus was?? What if Joseph didn't heed the warning from angel of the Lord who told him in a dream to escape to Eqypt?? But as Christians, we know that every link and every step was carefully planned and known well in advance by God our Father, and that the miraculous birth of our Lord and glorious resurrection into Heaven had absolutely no chance of being altered or changed in any way. There was no chance for a deviation to the plan, and no chance for anyone or anything to get in the way of God's plan to offer us the gift of eternal life through His Son.



All throughout the year we can rely on the complete confidence that Jesus is watching over us, knowing our hearts and guiding our paths even when we may think they are getting off track. If we ever feel a shred of doubt and wonder if Jesus is not listening or our prayers are not being heard, we can rest assured knowing that the answer is always, **Not a chance!!**

We are meeting monthly, supporting each other, and enjoying our social time. Four years ago we started assembling the flood buckets for disaster relief and have now completed 31. Each bucket costs us about \$75. For several years we have wrapped some of the boxes for Operation Christmas Child and wrapped about 40 this year.

And this year we've assembled 45 hygiene kits. These kits cost about \$10 each and we have been given the money to purchase specific supplies. We wish to continue putting these kits together and expect in the future to ask friends at church for money for the project. If disaster hits and a person is left with nothing UMCOR can hand out a hygiene kit -- a plastic bag with towel, washcloth, soap, comb, toothbrush, nail clip, bandaids.

# PARSONAGE UPDATE...



Renovations are continuing and we are really looking forward to seeing the final product. The kitchen has been gutted, a new wood floor, plumbing and electrical wiring have been installed, and a new control board was purchased for the boiler. The Sexton is painting the walls, trim and ceilings and the remaining carpets have been cleaned. As was reported in last month's newsletter, the permit for the addition was sent to the town. Unfortunately, like any of the best laid plans, we have met with some

obstacles. With a lot of work, an attitude of optimism and through active prayer we have been able to resolve these issues. Below is a summery of where we are and where we are going.

On November 12<sup>th</sup>, the Architectural drawings for the addition were finalized and a request for the building permit was filed with the Town of Guilderland. Based on the Albany County Tax Map and discussions with the Town Building Department, we had been advised our lot was deemed an undersized lot and we did not need a variance to obtain our building permit. After four weeks of waiting for the building permit to be issued, the Trustees called the Town Inspector who advised that they are really backed up and had not yet looked at our application. On December 15th, the Town Inspector advised us that the Albany County Tax Map, was wrong and we actually did need a variance from the Zoning Board of Appeals before the building permit could be issued. The Inspector advised us that he had never seen an incorrect tax map, and that since our parcel is not an undersized lot (which requires only an 8' setback from the neighboring property line), our addition had to be at least 15' from the side lot boundary, or we needed a variance from this requirement. This unexpected development has pushed back the construction schedule by four weeks. The only survey we had of the property was when the neighborhood was first subdivided and it did not provide an accurate location of the house. This meant that we needed to get a survey and get it fast.

While it would have been easy to give up hope, optimism prevailed, and we were miraculously able to find a surveyor who could meet our deadline. We obtained a survey at a cost \$2,400 and submitted our request for a variance on Thursday December 23<sup>rd</sup> to be heard at the January 5<sup>th</sup> Zoning Board meeting. The survey shows our addition will be located 14.45' from the side boundary line so we were assured that a variance would be granted, or that the Board would determine that a variance would not be necessary due to the minor encroachment the survey shows.





On December 27<sup>th</sup> the town informed us verbally that we in fact, do not need a variance. While the delays and issues with the town were stressful and frustrating, we were thankful to God that our prayers were answered.

These delays have been a source of great frustration but rest assured, we are doing everything we can to make sure that this parsonage will be a home to be proud of. Now that the winter is here and construction is delayed, it does mean that construction will be still ongoing after Pastor Jeff and his family have been moved in. However, the construction on the addition will all be completed outside of the main home and once complete the contractors will break through to the main house. This prevents construction workers from having to be in the house itself while building the addition. The contractor has determined this breakthrough will only take a day or two. It is important to the team to have the construction be as little of a disruption as possible. We would like to thank everyone who has supported these efforts and ask that you continue to pray for the completion of this project.















# MEALS FOR THE HOMELESS


Our church provides meals for the Capital District Area Council of Churches' Homeless Shelter in Albany, on the second and fourth Monday of each month, from November through April.

## CWS CROP WALK CELEBRATION

On December 7, 2021, the writer watched a video celebrating 75 years of service provided by Church World Service (CWS). It started in May 1946 as a way to provide global relief following World War II. While the emphasis is on world hunger, CWS actually does so much more. For example, it provides disaster relief, reclamation of land for farming, irrigation systems, medical services, and, of course, food. I have been part of this effort (on and off) for 40 years or so; but, it is only after watching this video and seeing the faces and hearing the stories of those who have been helped, did this program become so profoundly real! The host of this program mentioned that, for the 2021 CROP Walks around the country, a total of \$5.9 million dollars has been raised to date. Of that amount, \$1.7 million stays in this country to fund over 1,600 food services. He also mentioned 5 individual walkers who, collectively, raised \$212,000.00 in 2021! To say that is astonishing is to under-state it. This works to \$42,400.00 EACH!! But, this is about more than incredible numbers; it is about the men, women, and children locally and globally who literally could not survive with the aid of CWS.

The next Albany CROP Walk for Hunger will be, as usual, the first Sunday in May 2022. I hope to be the team captain for McKownville United Methodist Church next year. May 2022 is a long way off; but, as with other events, the sooner we start thinking about them, the more successful they are likely to be. As I understood, the 2022 Albany CROP Walk will be live unless pandemic issues require the event to be "virtual" as it was in 2020 and 2021. That being the case, I hope to be able to pick up resource material (posters, pledge envelopes, pamphlets describing the work) after the first of the year. There will be announcements about that in the coming months.

Thank you all for your generous support of this walk over the past decades as walkers and sponsors. Because of this level of support, the Albany CROP Walk in 2021 was again the 5th most successful walk in terms of funds raised in the nation. As previously reported, over \$100,000.00 was raised last May. Keeping in mind the ever increasing need around the world and in our own communities and around the world it is our prayer that the 2022 walks are the most successful ever.



Aids to being Worship Leader -

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time.

The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.

Some countries celebrate Epiphany on the first Sunday after January 1st and in Columbia they celebrate the day on the second Sunday of January.

The Epiphany is also called Three Kings' Day, Theophany, Denha, Little Christmas, and Baptism of Jesus. The Epiphany for the year 2022 is celebrated/observed on Thursday, January 6th.


Epiphany is a Christian holiday primarily commemorating the <u>Magi</u>'s visit to the baby <u>Jesus</u> and the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist. Eastern traditions, which usually call the holiday Theophany, focus on Jesus' baptism, seen as the manifestation of Christ as both fully human and fully divine. Western traditions focus on the Magi's visit, seen as the first manifestation of Christ as saviour of Gentiles as well as Jews. Epiphany is among the church's oldest and most important feasts.
