Everyone is welcome to worship with us in person or watch the service on line.



PARSONAGE UPDATE...

By the time you are reading this, Pastor Jeff and his family will have moved into the new parsonage. While there is still construction of the addition going on, a lot of renovations and improvements have been completed inside the house. Thanks to a lot of volunteers, great contractors, and God's blessings we were able to do a lot in the house.

The home has three bedrooms on the first floor and one on the second, a main bathroom on the first floor and a second bathroom upstairs, a family room, kitchen, and living room/dining room. The house had a wall between the original living room and the kitchen. As part of the renovations that wall was removed to open the space up to the kitchen for a more open concept. This allows that living room to have more flexibility in its use as it can now be used as a dining room if so desired. The kitchen has been totally remodeled with new wood floors, new counters and a new island, a new refrigerator, microwave, stove, and dishwasher. Additionally, a new sink, garbage disposal, lights and cabinets were installed. In the family room a new wool carpet and ceiling fan were installed. Ceiling fans were also installed in two of the downstairs bedrooms. Every room in the house, including the closets, was painted and blinds were installed. For the living/dining room curtains were purchased and installed and new lights were added to the ceiling. Multiple smoke/CO2 detectors were installed throughout the house. A washer and dryer have been provided. A new runner was put on the stairs leading to the upstairs bedroom. The downstairs bathroom has a new dual flush toilet and a new countertop, sink and faucet. Since the master bedroom is getting a brand-new closet, the old closet was flipped into another bedroom to give that room extra closet space. The front door has been replaced and a new garage door opener has been provided. The house has a one car garage and a carport. In the backyard there are several sheds where a lawn mower and snowblower are stored along with several other items. The addition will provide the house with a new closet, bathroom, and laundry room with all new fixtures and an accessible shower. The contractor has completed the foundation and is in the process of building the frame.

We are enormously proud of the work that has been done on house and are looking forward to having a beautiful home for our pastor and his family. Please pray for Jeff and his family as they make this transition and complete their move.

CALENDAR YEAR 2021 FINANCIAL REPORT TO CONGREGATION

Members and Friends – Congratulations on your response to the 2021 fiscal needs of McKownville United Methodist Church! Thank you! Collectively we have supported the annual budget, given beyond the budget to charitable causes outside our congregation, and responded to the request for funds to provide a parsonage for our pastor.

A total of \$239,237 was given toward operational costs. Fifty-six persons/families who pledged gave \$202,427 and 37 persons/families who did not pledge gave \$36,810. In addition, monies that could not be identified with any particular person averaged \$80 a week. Building use, half of normal, was impacted by the Covid pandemic. Our two Brooks Chicken BBQs together raised seven thousand dollars. In all, we received

More than half of our spending was for people: our pastor (salary, housing, health insurance, retirement, continuing education), administrative assistant, organist, choir director, and our share of Social Security taxes on non-pastoral staff. Total cost of staff was 57% of our annual spending.

Trustees keep us warm, safe, and dry. They arrange for trash pickup, grass cutting, snow removal, repair and maintenance of equipment, pest control, insurance on property and workers. They make sure we have gas, electricity, and water. Those ordinary costs were 26% of budget this year.

Ministry Shares sent to Upper New York Conference pay for a bishop, eight District Superintendents, various boards, the means to make them effective, and some global charities. In 2021, that was 14% of budget.

Office costs include preparing, printing, and mailing paper copies of our newsletter, postage for general mailings, and miscellaneous needs like paper clips and tape. Office costs were 1.5% of budget.

Our programs – educating our children and ourselves, worshiping together, reaching out to neighbors – totaled \$3719, a mere 1.5% of budget. We spent nothing on "Outreach" and a pittance on "Fellowship and Growth." The part of McKownville Church that is to make disciples of Jesus uses only a tiny part of our resources. How important is discipleship relative to other activities.

In summary, for 2021, we show income greater than expenses. The difference \$4,157 will be carried forward to the operating budget for 2022. We have not had a surplus at the end of the year for some time. We should congratulate ourselves. But keep in mind that we spend very little on discipleship.

In addition to the operating budget of the church, other causes request and receive our money. Contributions to these are above and beyond your annual pledge to the operating budget. Some are denominational, some local. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) provides immediate help to those injured by natural events or human disasters. Think hurricanes, tornadoes, earthquakes, floods, forest fires – UMCOR is there quickly to respond to pressing needs. UMCOR also funnels money to international causes such as Africa University. There were special offerings for World Wide Communion and Native American Sunday. Locally we gave to poorer families through our Christmas Tree of gifts and we sent 103 boxes to Operation Christmas Child. In 2021, this giving was at least \$2,900. "At least" because we keep no records of donations through our Christmas Tree program or Guilderland Food Pantry.

The Pumpkin Patch, open eight to ten hours daily from late-September through Halloween, offers pumpkins to our neighbors and raises money for national and international mission projects. This year's Pumpkin Patch raised \$7,525, all for missions and none for operating budget.

The Trustees have a fund to accumulate monies to handle unforeseen emergencies. Some congregations call these "rainy day" funds. In 2021, the Trustees received \$12,088 as direct gifts, as rent from our neighbors Renaissance Florists and Dunkin' Donuts, and from donated clothing in our collection bins. The Trustees' Fund had expenses of \$2,300 in 2021.

The Pastor's Contingency Fund provides small gifts to temporarily needy folks.

To donate to any of these non-budget causes, write a check to the church and indicate on the memo line the particular cause you wish to support. Support can also be as a volunteer, especially for the Pumpkin Patch. Program teams welcome new members. Contact the team chair.

Parsonage! We purchased a home on Ableman Avenue as a parsonage for our pastor. The estimated cost for purchase and renovations was \$300,000. In 2021 we received donations of \$98,833 cash and stock. This strong support enabled timely acquisition and renovation of the property. It will also help in obtaining a favorable mortgage. Thanks to all who contributed. In addition to cash, gifts included donation of legal advice and labor talents installing a new parsonage kitchen. This will be a continuing need until we pay off the mortgage.




We now begin a new year. An operating budget was presented to Leadership Council January 2022. It reflected the usual needs for staff, physical plant, parsonage, and benevolences. Proposed spending, about the same as 2021 and based on last year's experience, seems sound. Anticipated giving is less certain. Our November 2021 Financial Campaign resulted in 46 pledges for a total commitment of \$159,000. We need a third more money and a third more commitment! That is a challenge, and the challenge is both financial and spiritual. Should/Could/Will our congregation be a larger presence in our neighborhood in 2022? One resource available to make this happen is our collective mix of people and talents. No one can do everything; many can do something; together we can complete the task. Pick a cause that is dear to your heart and join a team to make it happen!

Protocol of Reconciliation & Grace Through Separation





December 12, 2021, there was a congregational meeting to discuss the **Protocol of Reconciliation & Grace Through Separation** that will come before the 2022 General Conference for discussion and decision. The informational handouts (conversation guide & Grace through Separation proposals) on the proposed split of the United Methodist Church remain available. Also, the full minutes of the meeting are available the church office.

The proposal includes: a sum of monies to be split between the separating church/es; any policy changes will be made by the remaining UMC after separation/s complete; churches who choose to disaffiliate as an independent church (instead of joining a new Methodist denomination recognized through the process) lose their building and assets; pensions and such would transfer to the new Methodist denomination/s.

While there are challenges facing the congregation, our mission remains the same: to make disciples for Jesus Christ. And the example set by our founder John Wesley remains: "Is thine heart right, as my heart is with thy heart? If it be, give me thine hand." Even if we are not in complete agreement, we can work together based on our foundations.

Questions for the congregation to consider include: So how will we as a congregation continue to seek ways to reach our community more effectively with the Gospel of Jesus Christ? How will we overcome barriers to accomplishing our mission?

Upper New York Conference should provide additional questions for churches to consider in the spring (perhaps March/April). When appropriate, another congregational meeting will be announced by the Leadership Council.





The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.
