How in the world did I end up here??



Did I drift so far and not realize it??

Another summer season is coming to an end. Fortunately, being near the beach has provided some additional days of swimming, boat trips, and hitting a few more bike and hiking trails than in past years. Yes, it's a pleasure to have the warm summer days extend beyond their calendar date and into the fall.


As wonderful as it is has been to spend a full summer near the ocean and so many nature trails, it took some getting used to. On more than one occasion in the middle of a hike or swim I'd stop and ask, "How did I end up here??" Just taking a swim in the seemingly calm waters of the Delaware

Bay - treading water, looking across the bay to see if Cape May is visible, having a nice relaxing swim... well, time to turn around and head back in. *Hey, where did our umbrella go? How did I get this far down the shoreline?? Did I drift this far and not even realize it?* Similarly on hiking paths I've learned the hard way that it only takes a minute or two off the marked trail to become confused and start backtracking to the designated path.

Having a few of those occurrences this summer made me think of just how easy it is to drift. We can usually stay clear of the visible rough waves and strong rapids, but we may not feel the slight and subtle currents that pull us away from where we thought we were going. Nor do we become overly concerned with just a "few steps" off the hiking trail until we look around and realize we've gone much farther than we imagined and are now lost.

Yes indeed, mother nature can teach us some tough lessons in a short amount of time, and we all need to be aware and alert of how the small, barely noticeable drifting can leave us asking that unsettling question, "How in the world did I end up here??"

And the same can be said of our spiritual lives. Slowly, overtime, we can drift. # Healing Ministry

## MIRACLE HEALING

Welcome everyone to our Ministry of Healing. Everyday every one of us will make time for our personal prayers. Before and after we pray, some will trust that the Lord Jesus Christ, will answer our prayer. Some may have doubt. But the Lord Jesus Christ, said , "My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I too, am working." ( John 5:17 ). From this scripture, we can understand that God is working all the time, with out a break or a day off. When we pray, prayer is expressing our petition to God, confession, and our relationship with him. A devote petition to God Almighty or an object of worship is our prayer.

Prayer is a spiritual communication with God, supplication, thanksgiving, adoration, and confession. This crippled man sat there and asked money from the people who go to the Temple.



While Peter and John were walking near this crippled man, he asked for money to help for his daily life. This man never knew that within a moment his life was going to change into a new life. Peter looked straight at him and then Peter said, "Look at us." (Act3:4). So the man paid no attention, expecting something from them. (Act 3:5-11) Then Peter said, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. He jumped to his feet and began walking and jumping. and praising God."



An amazing Power of Healing touched the crippled man. How much help was need every day from medical care for crippled feet and ankles? The crippled man expected just one day of help, but something was much better than the money he got. He got permanent healing to walk and work again. His entire life was changed into this new beginning. Let us read again what Peter said to the crippled man, "In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth walk." The immediate healing power came from the Lord. He filled the crippled man from head to toe of his body, and displayed the healing mercy an



Jesus Christ. The cripple man was healed. Not only were his physical problems healed, but all of his problems were healed. From now, no one needs to beg for help or money. No more worries.

I remember what one of my favorite teacher's in my high school said to the students, "Give him all your tears, give him all your fears, give him all your failures that weigh you down and your questions for your tomorrows. Because the cases for you, more than anybody else, Jesus cares for you and He will stand by you. More than anybody Jesus care for you."

United Methodist churches observe World Communion Sunday on the third Sunday in October. The observance focuses the attention of United Methodists on the universal and inclusive nature of the church.

Did you know World Communion Sunday is over 40 years old? According to the 1972 Book of Discipline ¶ 163.b there shall be a World Communion (formerly Fellowship of Suffering and Service) offering to support the division of chaplains and ministries, Crusade Scholarships and the scholarship fund for minority groups.

World Communion Sunday funds Ethnic Scholarships for international students. World Communion Scholarship Leadership Development Program from General Board of Global Ministries intentionally facilitates the educational preparation and training of mission partners from around the world.

## *Emergency Overflow Homeless Shelter Dinners*

The protein for the entrée does not need to be meat. Macaroni and cheese, vegetarian chili, rice and beans, and cheese lasagna are some suggestions for those who may wish to provide a meatless meal. Any meal you are able to prepare is welcome as this may be the only meal the guests will have that day.

## Thomas Webb – Early Methodist Lay Preacher in America



Thomas Webb was termed “*American Methodism’s Layman Number One*” for good reason. As a young man, Thomas Webb enrolled in the British army in the 1740’s and worked his way up the ranks. In 1755 Webb was commissioned a lieutenant in the 48<sup>th</sup> Regiment and went with it to America. In his third engagement, he lost his right eye in a battle against the French in Quebec. In 1760 Webb married Mary Arding from Jamaica, Long Island and they had a son Charles.

Then in 1764 the regiment was recalled for service in Ireland. Though Webb had been recommended for a Captaincy and the command of a Company, he retired as Lieutenant to remain in America. He received a civilian appointment as Barrack Master at the fort in Albany, New York and was known as “Captain.” Also, he was given special permission to receive both his Lieutenant half-pay and the Albany emolument.

Unfortunately, Webb’s American wife Mary died and “in extreme agony of soul” Thomas left his young son with Mary’s brother, Dr. Arding, and went on leave to England. There he became converted during a sermon and soon after he “*determined to live and die with the Methodist people.*” Called to preach when the scheduled speaker did not come, Webb told – movingly - the story of his conversion. John Wesley gave him the status of local preacher.

Back in Albany later in 1765, Webb engaged in Methodist evangelism – the first such preaching at least in New York State. Meanwhile Palatine refugee Philip Embury started preaching in New York City in 1766. In early 1767 Webb visited New York City where his preaching encouraged the people and increased numbers. He joined the new Methodist Society in New York and is reported to have introduced himself as “*Thomas Webb of the King’s service; a soldier of the Cross; a spiritual son of John Wesley.*”

“Captain” Webb’s commandant at Albany relieved Webb of some routine Barrack Master duties so he could concentrate on religious matters. Over the next several years, Thomas Webb would establish several key Methodist societies along the Atlantic seaboard, including in Long Island, Trenton (New Jersey), Delaware, and Philadelphia (Pennsylvania). Webb also contacted John Wesley pleading for competent preachers as there was great need; one of those who came and stayed was Francis Asbury. A Methodist historian notes “*and it all started in Albany.*”

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

#### Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

*Be early and get ready:* On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.
