Is it really that time of year already? Is our Thanksgiving Holiday just around the corner? Soon we'll be wishing each other a happy New Year! Are we ready for another holiday season? The Lord Jesus helped Simon's mother-in-law to get up from her sick bed, and he spoke to her commanding for the fever to leave her. Immediately by his power the fever left her. In the gospel of Matthew, he says that Jesus touched the hand of a woman and her fever left her. In Luke, he spoke to the fever and it left her also. Each writer chose in different words to describe the action of healing and the power of the Lord, Jesus Christ. After she was healed, she may have served them a dinner. It was Friday evening after the sunset and the Sabbath and the day of rest, from Friday to the sunset on Saturday.

The Lord Jesus is teaching us through this healing scripture that we must speak to the sickness to have it leave from the sick person. Also he didn't allowed the demons to speak. Why didn't Jesus allow the

As per Mark 1:35, the scripture says that the Lord, Jesus Christ, woke up early one morning while it was still dark, left the house, and went to a solitary place to pray. He took time for personal prayer. Today many of us get up and go to work and say that they are busy and unable to find time for prayer. Prayer is vital in every believer. We must put aside all of our personal issues and find time to pray and to listen to what God says to us. We make so many appointments for our own needs; but, we must make time to spend with the Lord, Jesus Christ. He will heal all the diseases and all the problems by his commands. Many people are tired, have lost their hope in Jesus, are angry over the past failures, or given up on prayer. People will ask so many questions, but if we just sit and take the time to think deeply in our hearts and search where Jesus is in our lives, we will see that He is waiting to help us. This is illustrated by many bible stories including the Good Samaritan.

McKownville United Methodist Church has committed to providing meals the second and fourth Mondays of November through April. The Shelter is located at the

**First Lutheran Church at 626 State Street, Albany.** Meals include an Entrée (No pork or fish), veggie, and a dessert. Any other sides are optional, and always appreciated but not necessary.

The protein for the entrée does not need to be meat. Macaroni and cheese, vegetarian chili, rice and beans, and cheese lasagna are some suggestions for those who may wish to provide a meatless meal. Any meal you are able to prepare is welcome as this may be the only meal the guests will have that day.

# YEAR ENDING & YEAR BEGINNING



This year still has two full months to run, but various leadership teams have started planning for next year, 2023. There are several steps to planning, which are done in order.

First, Staff/Pastor Parish Relations Committee (SPPRC) in October prepares a covenant between pastor and congregation. A covenant is a relationship

between two partners who make binding promises to each other and who work together to reach a common goal. The two parties are companions, not competitors. This year's covenant encourages more disciple-making and strengthening congregational leadership. This covenant has been shared with the congregation. You can find a copy on the table in the back of the sanctuary.

Second, once a covenant is in place, the Spiritual Gifts Team identifies leaders and members for various Teams. Members of these teams, focused on particular areas, lay out ideas and then work to turn those ideas into concrete actions. When you are asked to become a member of one of our teams, please give prayerful consideration to joining and helping. We are not asking for a life-time commitment, but please stay on a team for a few years. Spiritual Gifts does its work in October and November.

Third, the Finance Team lays out a tentative budget. This early budget includes "must have" items: pastor salary and benefits, staff salaries, operation and maintenance of our physical facilities, and insurance. Together, these things primarily benefit members and friends of our church. The budget must also support Sunday morning worship, music, and educational experiences to current disciples and future attendees/disciples of all ages. Our local ministry includes providing meeting space to a dozen recovery groups addressing addictions (alcohol, gambling, & narcotics). Other McKownville United Methodist Church lead ministries include: a Seniors group meeting Thursday morning, a Women Together group and a biblically based small group ministry. Beyond local programs, we help others through our Ministry Shares which support United Methodist outreach and ministry programs at the state, national, and international level. An example of our Ministry Shares at work is supporting Africa University in Mutare, Zimbabwe.

Although not a part of our budget, we (McKownville Church disciples) also respond/donate to natural disasters through the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), sponsor mission trips to domestic or foreign places in need of volunteer service, contribute to the Guilderland Food Bank, or any of the dozen other special offerings identified by Upper New York Conference. AND, let's not forget the Christmastime gifts we give to local families.

Steps 1-3 are all preparatory to approval. The November annual Charge Conference accepts reports from church Teams and approves the pastor's compensation package. At its December or January meeting, Leadership Council approves the "final" fiscal year budget. Both the Annual Report and the minutes of the January Leadership

Council will also include a list of Team members and leaders.

To give next year's leaders and teams a good start, it is important to support this year's budget well so that there is not a significant giving under-run. Please support our church's ministries by bringing your current giving commitment up-to-date and make a pledging commitment for next year. <u>Even better –</u> <u>bring a friend to church</u>.

# LEADERSHIP COUNCIL PONDERING A NEW IDEA IN CHURCH MANAGEMENT...



Like other Methodist churches, McKownville United Methodist Church manages its ministry and

decision-making through a Leadership Council. Our Leadership Council consists of persons with various roles: (1) chairpersons of ministry teams (Christian Education, Fellowship & Growth, Finance, Historian, Membership Secretary, Memorials & Gifts, Outreach, Seniors, Spiritual Gifts, Staff/PastorParish Relations Committee, Trustees, Visuals, Worship);(2) persons with designated roles (Financial Secretary, Lay Leader, Lay

Minister of Healing, Lay Representative to Annual Conference, Treasurer), and six Persons Atlarge. In total, our Leadership Council has 24 positions filled by 18 persons (some people hold more than one position).

Some denominational consultants warn that large meeting size leads to inefficient use of member's time and to protracted decision making. In recent years, some churches in Upper New York Conference have switched to a smaller oversight group with more focus on decision-making and less on work of ministry teams. This approach to church management has been termed a "one board model". Ministry Teams focus on their particular area and report to a "Leadership Board" while the "Leadership Board" focuses on policy and decision-making.

October 18, Leadership Council heard a presentation from Plattsburgh United Methodist Church within our Conference about this method. They have been using this model for six years. Advantages, disadvantages, learning experiences, and growing pains were acknowledged. Questions from our Leadership Council were answered in a forthright manner. Overall, they have been pleased at the outcome and they offered further assistance should we wish.

Leadership Council plans to study this model, receive comment from the congregation, and make a decision early in 2023 whether to adopt this form of church governance. Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.


