"Let the field's be jubilant and everything in them and then all the trees of the forest will sing for joy. They will sing before the Lord for He comes, He comes, to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness and all people in His truth." (Psalm 97:12-13)

Welcome and wishing everyone a "HAPPY NEW YEAR!" I hope everyone had a wonderful Christmas celebration with their families and friends. After we enjoyed the birth of the Messiah, we are now entering into a fresh new year. Let us put our first step in this first month of January, 2023, by holding the hand of the Messiah. Everyone may be very anxious to know, "How is the new year, 2023, going to be? Just like people in the old testament and the new testament who were waiting for the coming of the Messiah.

In the new testament, the gospel of Luke was announcing the birth of the Messiah by his medical experiences. As per history Luke was a physician. They kings were called Magi, their names are King Melchior from Persia, King Balthazar from Macedonia, Saba is present Yemen and King Caspar was called by name Gundophores from Afghanistan Pakistan and some other part of India. We can only wonder how these kings joined together. Three different religious kings were found at the star of Bethlehem. The may have ancient manuscripts of old testaments and they read about the birth of the Holy Child as per the prophet Isaiah and other prophets. They wanted to see the Messiah.

In that period, there were no phones, cell phones, or computers for communication and no GPS systems either. But they may communicated with each other and made a resolution of travel by following the star of Bethlehem. They had to look at the sky at the bright star, and that was their GPS. Oh! God is it easy for their travel? Just imagine, when we use our GPS, it may guide us on the wrong route and often we get made at the GPS and then we have to turn and drive in ae different direction to reach our destiny. If we travel with family, no wonder, everyone could get angry, finally argument. Young children screaming, and teens commenting, "Hi dad did you follow the GPS?" Their car could be filled with stress. They may stop the car at a resting area, buy coffee, food, sit around a table and look at each other or they may make a plan to continue driving.

The three kings may read in our old testament Number 24:17, "I see him but not now, I behold him, but not near. A Star will rise out of Jacob." It was probably this prophecy that convinced the three kings to travel to search for the Baby Jesus.

The other scripture in the old testament of Joel, "blow the trumpet in Zion, sound the alarm on my holy hill. Let all who live in the land tremble for the day coming."

Some of the scientific researchers say that the star was the conjunction of Jupiter, Saturn, and Mars in 6 B.C. Whatever the distance or how hard the travel was going to be, the three kings wanted to go. They never gave up their plans to travel. How did they meet and how they communicate with each other with different languages? It was amazing! Maybe they selected the silk road rout of Taxila near Islamabad. And they may travelled nearly 2000 K.M to 3219 K.M and they may traveled nearly two year and six months. What were the Persian, middle eastern, and Hindu kings teaching us?

No, matter who they were in their high positions, they were willing to leave their palaces and travel in the wilderness. We can see their strong faith and determination to see the Messiah. They may stop traveling during the days to sleep, eat, feed the camels, and travel in the night focusing the Star of Bethlehem. Maybe they traveled on smooth roads, hard roads, passed wild animals, passed thieves, but their stubborn hearts continued their travel. Amen.

We also, travel every day in our life's journey just like these three kings. We must have the united mind and heart also. Leave all the conflicts, anger, and anxieties to reach the Messiah. These three kings never kept the King Herod order, but they focused on the star and they continued to travel. Among the three kings, one of the King's, Caspar, never knew that in the future he was going to meet one of the real desirables of the Lord, Jesus Christ, in India and be baptized to convert him and his family from Hinduism to Christianity. Soon I will give full story about that.

The three kings reached the destination of the manger. They saw Mary and Joseph with the sweet little Holy Child of Messiah Jesus Christ. They offered gold, frankincense, and myrrh as gifts for Him. Now what gift are we going to offer to our Lord? He wants you to just come to Him no matter wherever you are whether you are rich or poor, have a job or no job, have a home or no home. Just come to Him and trust Him. He will hold you, take away your burdens from your life travel, give you the shining of star of joy, and peace and to heal you from all the sickness. Just come he loves you more than this world. Amen

Let us feel that we are in the manger with Mary, Joseph, and with the Holy Child and bow our heads and pray: Holy Father, God almighty, we come to the manger to adore and worship your son, Jesus Christ, and offer ourselves and our families as a gift into your hands. Father, we surrender all our mistakes of sins, wash us, and shine your light on us and in our homes. Bless us in this New Year of 2023 to fill all our needs, give perfect health and healing, and give joy and peace. Lay thy mighty hands on our children and fill them with your holy wisdom to

obey you, give wisdom to become educated, and bless them to have the right friends. Teach them to follow you. We humble ourselves and offer many thanks at your nailed feet in your precious name, Jesus Christ. Amen

This shelter is operated in the belief that a ministry of hospitality and sanctuary is a mission of the Christian Church that scripture compels us to welcome and minister to the most vulnerable and needy in our society. This is illustrated by many bible stories including the Good Samaritan.

McKownville United Methodist Church has committed to providing meals the second and fourth Mondays of November through April. The Shelter is located at the **First Lutheran Church at 626 State Street, Albany.** Meals include an Entrée (No pork or fish), veggie, and a dessert. Any other sides are optional, and always appreciated but not necessary.

The protein for the entrée does not need to be meat. Macaroni and cheese, vegetarian chili, rice and beans, and cheese lasagna are some suggestions for those who may wish to provide a meatless meal. Any meal you are able to prepare is welcome as this may be the only meal the guests will have that day.

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

#### Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.






