

2023 John U. Miller Memorial CROP Walk May 7, 2023



Since 1980, the Capital Area Council of Churches (CACC) has held an annual CROP Walk for Hunger in Albany. Over the course of those years, the walks have raised \$2,678,192.00. Of that amount, 25% (\$582,151.00) has been provided to the 26 local food pantries and soup kitchens serving the 65,000 people needing their support to provide food security for themselves and their families. In 2022, a new local record for money raised was: reached: \$112,592.00; this amount ranked the walk 6th out of 550 walks nationwide in terms of funds collected! Of that amount raised last year, \$29,063.00 was distributed among the local food pantries and soup kitchens.

This effort, however, is about much more than moneyIT IS ABOUT PEOPLE!!! Men, women, and children who simply would starve to death without this help! It's about families struggling in their homes as well as homeless people trying to survive on our streets and seeking shelter in our rescue missions and overflow shelters.

Yes, 75% of the money raised is given to Church World Service to support their incredible efforts locally, nationally, and globally. BUT! It is all one incredible effort to meet a daunting challenge of providing humanitarian aid when/where needed.

For those who would like to direct their contributions to an agency or cause rather than the Church World Service itself, I can provide a list of 20 specific options toward which contributions can be directed.

For those who are unable to walk on May 7th, or would prefer to walk with a smaller group, that is also possible. You may walk any day during the month of May, and walk wherever you wish. Last year, of the 300 people who actually walked, about 150 chose to walk

elsewhere at other times. All that is necessary is that all money pledged be paid by June 9, 2023. In the context of paying, it is now possible to pay online. Just go to www.crophungerwalk.org/albanyny. Once there, click on the link for McKownville United Methodist Church. At that point, you may either make your donation or register to join the team. (I have already set up the team name—which is simply the church—and myself as recruiter).

For those of you who would like to walk to raise money through sponsors, I will be available to provide envelopes and donor records. The envelopes are used to turn the money in to the CROP Walk the day of the event, mail the money to the CACC office (First Lutheran Church, 646 State Street, Albany, NY 12203), or give them back to me and I will submit the funds collected to the CACC.

Watch for future announcements about informational programs—including a speaker discussing the connection between climate change and world hunger. She is a meteorologist from Channel 10 News by the name of Jill Szwed. (I spoke with her at the March 19th CROP Walk rally and confirmed her willingness to speak with us.)

Finance Team Letter to the MUMC Congregation

It is great to have a very special place where we can connect with God and each other as we mature in our spiritual journeys. Every Sunday at McKownville United Methodist Church we celebrate God's love at worship, grow as disciples of Christ, and invite others into discipleship. How exciting is that! Our ministry does not end there, it continues throughout the week. We transform lives by hosting various recovery groups. We collect and distribute food and other items for the Guilderland Food pantry and we support relief efforts, both locally and worldwide. Truly, we are blessed to be a spirit filled, mission driven church.

Lately, however, we have been challenged in financially supporting our ministry programs and covering our church expenses. To close our budget in 2022, we used \$14,190 from our Budget Supplemental Fund, a fund established a few years ago from a donation given specifically for closing budget gaps.

In 2023 we are looking at a potential \$48,149 budget gap between expenses and current giving levels and fund raisers. To close this gap, church leaders developed this plan:

- Hold additional fund-raising events and projects to raise \$7,500.
- Use \$22,649 from the Budget Supplemental Fund. (Keep in mind, if we continue to use this fund to this extent every year, the fund will be depleted in just a few years.)

Ask members and friends to consider increasing their contributions, pledges, donations, and service by 10% to raise \$18,000.

From our Church Historian...



Oldest Members of McKownville United Methodist Church

William R. Seim - When Bill died at age 92 on March 3, 2023, he was the oldest continuous member of McKownville United Methodist Church. Bill, born in 1930, joined this church on December 7, 1941. He graduated from Altamont High School in 1947 and was employed at Travelers Insurance Company for forty-three years. He married in 1986. Besides church, Bill was active in Boy Scouts and the Westmere Fire Department.

Ildra E. Ableman Morse – Ildra joined this church as a teenager November 2, <u>1947</u>, and married Carl Morse in October 1960 (who joined later that month by transfer). They celebrated their 60th anniversary, reaffirming their vows – a year late because of COVID – on October 9, 2021. Ildra was the Sunday School teacher for many years, starting in the done-over chicken coops (*see picture* on next page).

Carl and Ildra, for many years took care of the altar with its candles and vestments. They also changed the sign board every week for several years. A memorial brick by Carl and Ildra Morse and family is in the 2016 memorial patio, telling: "So now faith, hope, love abide these three, but the greatest of these is love" 1 Corinthians 13:13.



(Left to right on church steps morning after an overnight next door. Barbara Rutenber (now Wells), Marion Pressier (Leizer), Janet Brown (Talleur) with Joyce Temple (Crouse) in front (c. 1952). Marion Jeanne Preisser Leizer – Marion comes from a line of previous McKownville UMC members as noted by her 2016 memorial patio brick: "So we may never forget former members: My grandma Ethel Allanson [wife of James Allanson] Aunt Marion A. Cook Mother Susan A. Barre [married 1st Wm. Preisser + 2nd Gerald Barre] Aunt Jeanne A. Regan Aunt Ruth A. Rowe With love forever, Marion Jeanne Leizer." Marion joined this church March 28, 1948 as a confirmand. She graduated from The Milne School in Albany in 1955 and married Ralph Leizer in 1962 (who died in 2022 after 60 years together). Marion worked for Eastern Airlines and has been quite active in church, including Fairiety etc, and still sings.





Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.

7 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' "


8 Then they remembered his words.

9 When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others.


10 It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles.


