
FROM RURAL TO SUBURBAN



Welcome everyone and welcome to the House of God. After all the camping, travelling, and vacations, by the grace of the Lord God we are refreshed and have strength to focus on our daily lives. When we step into The House of God, He is waiting to welcome us, to see us, and speak to us. He always loves us and gives His faith for us. But, do we put all our faith and trust in Him? When things go wrong, changes occur and have struggles wondering if our faith is draining out? We are not living in a peaceful world, but one full of stress and do we get tired of praying? Some people have so many thoughts about their faith. Why do we have to have faith in the Lord God?



Almighty? What is the meaning of faith? The apostle, Paul, says in Hebrew 11:1, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Can we have faith in the bible? Festival of Praise

The regional inter-church FESTIVAL OF PRAISE was started in 1970 as a "symbol of the beauty to be achieved through Christian Unity." While the resulting June 1971 concert at the Saratoga Performing Arts Center was initially intended to be a single production, it became an annual event for many years (pictured below June 8, 1974). In 1975, the about five hundred voices represented over 150 churches and "almost every Christian denomination in the area."



McKownville United Methodist Church members were part of this musical praise.

McKownville UMC contributed \$100 each year from 1973 through 1982. Festival of Praise also sang at various events and locales, including June 27, 1974 at Washington Cathedral (D.C.) and July 2, 1976 ("three hundred voice choir") at Empire State Plaza as part of the celebration of the opening there of the New York State Museum in the Cultural Education Center.

After the 1982 concert, this ecumenical choir was disbanded. A *Festival Celebration Choir* was founded in 1985 and rehearses at First Lutheran Church in Albany. An 10th Anniversary Concert June 1996 at The Empire Center at the Egg commemorated 25 years of ecumenical singing.

Adult Forum

ADULT FORUM BEGINS IN SEPTEMBER!

CHOICE OF TWO TIMES!



At McKownville UMC, we call Sunday school for adults ADULT FO-RUM. Adult Forum has not met the past three years due to Covid-19. Restart will begin in September with a choice of two meeting times. One group will meet Thursdays 12:15 to 1:15 pm beginning Thursday September 14. Another group will meet Monday evening 7:00-800 pm beginning September 18. Actual meeting times may be shifted by each group. *No Adult Forum on Sunday mornings*.

The format is group discussion guided by a short introductory video. Topics may include Christianity. Methodism. church history, a study

of Bible or scriptures, specific teachings, important personalities, current social issues, or other religions. If your favorite topic is not on this list, bring it to our meetings. The Adult Forum room is located near the end of the main hallway, third room on the left, across from the Library. Look for a sign on the door.

The first three meetings will be guided by viewing lectures from the series "Great Figures of the New Testament" by Amy-Jill Levine, Professor of New Testament Studies at Vanderbilt University.

<u>Sept 14/18: Jesus of</u> Nazareth—This talk on "the Jesus of history" will help us sort out major post-Enlightenment approaches such as source, form, and redaction criticism, and then help us weigh more recent scholarly reconstructions of who Jesus was, what he did, and what he taught.

<u>Sept 21/25: Paul, the Epistolary</u> Evangelist—Meet Paul as he is known through the Acts of the Apostles, a companion volume to the Gospel of Luke, where Paul first appears at the martyrdom of Stephen.

<u>Sept 28/Oct 2 The Christ of Faith</u>— In the New Testament and later theological writings, knowing Jesus means more than knowing what he said and did prior to his crucifixion. In this lecture we examine various accounts of "the Christ of faith" as he appears in the New Testament and beyond. In conclusion, we are reminded of what else can, and should, be studied, again and again (cf. John 21:25).

Topics for succeeding weeks will be chosen by members of the groups. Bring your ideas to the first class meeting.

Financial Information...

Financial Information about McKownville United Methodist Church

Below are some statistics about our financial situation. Overall, we have reason to be a bit optimistic about meeting our financial obligations by the end of 2023. However, we still face some challenges.

As of July 31, 2023 (58% of the year), we report income from all sources as \$137,995. This is about \$5 thousand less than budgeted. However, our budget included a withdrawal of ~\$48 thousand from our stock reserve fund. None of that reserve has been used so far in 2023. Members and friends are to be congratulated that current income is near budgeted without using any reserve!

Spending as of July 31 is below budget by ~\$8 thousand. That is, income to date is about \$3 thousand more than spending to date. Keep in mind that some spending is season related – lawn care will soon end but snow service will likely begin. Also, the overall Trustee budget was reduced from prior years by over \$22 thousand because we now clean the sanctuary and offices rather than hire a company. The next time you see a Trustee, thank them!

We are 58% through 2023. Contributions from persons who pledged is 74% of total pledges. The pledged-but-not-yet-given 26% alone will not be sufficient to meet our obligations at the end of the year. Earlier in 2023 we asked members and friends to voluntarily increase their annual pledge by 10%. These additional pledges of \$14,875 raised the annual amount pledged to \$176,771. Thank you to all who pledged more! Even so, a shortfall seems likely.

This year 50 individuals or families pledged \$161,896 toward our budget. As of June 30 ten had paid their pledge in full for the year 2023, twenty nine had paid 50% or more, and eleven were behind in their pledge. We thank the diligent givers and encourage those behind in their pledge to bring it current by the end of September.

Our last major fund raising event will be Brooks Chicken BBQ Saturday September 30. Watch for details. Please plan to help if you are able; just let Kelly Visker know. Tell your friends about the BBQ. Other fund raising ideas have been offered. If you see an idea that is right down your alley, grab it and go!

McKownville United Methodist Church is a noted and notable presence at the corner of Church Road and Western Avenue. Be part of increasing that presence.

Cleaning Kit Materials

- One five-gallon round bucket with lid (14.35" h x 12.19" w x 12.19" d)
 - o No screw lids
 - o May be used, but must be free from all residual product
 - o Advertisement on the outside acceptable
- One 32–64 oz. bottle liquid laundry detergent
- One 16–40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner
 - o No spray cleaners
- One 16–34 oz. bottle liquid dish soap
- One 4–8 oz. pump spray air freshener
- One 6–14 oz. pump spray insect repellant (pack of 10–20 wipes also acceptable)
 - o Pump spray bottles must have protective covers
- One scrub brush
 - o With or without handle
- 18 re-usable cleaning wipes
 - o No terrycloth, microfiber, or paper towels
 - o Remove from packaging
- Five scouring pads
 - o No stainless steel or pads with soap in them
 - o Remove from packaging

- 36–50 clothespins
- One 50–100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic line)
- 24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33–45-gallon sizes)
 - o Remove from packaging
- Five N95 particulate respirator dust masks (1–3 mm thickness)
 - o No surgical masks
- Two pairs kitchen gloves
 - o Durable for multiple uses
 - o Remove from packaging
- One pair work gloves
 - o Cotton with leather palm or all leather

Assembly Directions

- Place all liquid items on the bottom of the bucket.
- Place remaining items in the bucket fitting them around and between the liquid items.
- Scouring pads and trash bags can be separated in order to fit all items in the bucket.
- Clothespins may also be placed in a small re-sealable bag.
- Secure the lid on the filled bucket.

Important Notes

- All items must be new with the exception of the bucket and lid.
- All cleaning agents must be in liquid form. No powders are accepted.
- If items have been omitted, label bucket. Please indicate which items are missing.
- Sponges have been removed from the list of supplies due to the challenge of locating the non-cellulose sponges that prevent mildew. Non-cellulose sponges will be added to each bucket upon arrival at the affiliate warehouse.
- Do not include any personal notes, money, or additional materials in the kits.
- Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

Instructions for Packing and Shipping Kits

- Packed buckets cannot exceed 70 pounds.
- Complete two packing lists, one for your records and one for the shipping box. Place the shipping label/packing list on the outside of each box.
- Please send a check to Sager Brown for the total number of buckets times \$3 per bucket for the cost of sponges and shipping. One check may be written for the entire donation.

Cashier

Distributing the tickets when food is ordered and providing any change for cash sales. (This position is done while seated and does not require any standing or walking)

Sellers, Cash and Credit

Sell dinners to customers and take payment. Cash goes to cashiers.

Traffic Control

Directing cars to either the cash or credit line and helping with traffic flow for pickup and exit.

Set Up

Help set up the cones in the parking lot, tables in west vestibule and traffic signs. (This usually takes $1\frac{1}{2}$ - 2 hours depending on number of volunteers. There is a bit of lifting and carrying of items with this position.)

Money Manager

Receives money throughout the day and is responsible for accounting for all sales. (This is a seated position and does not require any standing or walking)

Signs

Holding signs by the road encouraging people to come to the BBQ.

Clean Up

Help pick up the cones, signs and tents and return to the church. Clean tables and other cleanup tasks.



The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.




