GOD IS CROWNING THE YEAR
"MY GOD GIVES YOU OF HEAVEN DEW AND EARTH'S RICHNESS AND ABUNDANCE OF GRAIN AND NEW
WINE." (GENESIS27:28-29)



Welcome everyone to our Ministry of Healing. We wish all of you a, "Happy and Blessed New Year in 2024 and may God Almighty bless you and make you fruitful and increase you." (Genesis 28:3-4). 

FROM OUR CHURCH HISTORIAN

State Road at Parker's Corners



State Road M.E. church

The Methodist church in McKownville, first built 1866 on the Great Western Turnpike, was the *second* mission church of the Guilderland Methodist Episcopal Church (located on Willow Street). The first mission church of the Guilderland church was State Road at Parker's Corners.

Beginnings: A trustee was elected August 22, 1864 for Parker's. The church was under construction by November **1864** on State Road, a second road running west from Albany through Guilderland out toward the Mohawk region (later called locally Old State Road). Charles Parker of NYC had built a house circa 1860 on West Old State Road near the current intersection of Rts. 20 & 158. When Parker heard several people were trying to establish a Methodist congregation he donated \$4,000 in 1864 (over \$78,000 in 2023 money). A church bell was purchased from Jones and Company Bell Foundry of Troy. There was a reported congregation of 30 when the Parker's

church opened in 1865. Both mission churches were built under Rev. Edward E. Taylor who had became the Methodist pastor for the Guilderland charge about April 1864.

Before the building came, there had been a **State** Road Bible Class as young Abram Carhart who "started for Dixie" in March 1863 to fight (delayed from December 1862 due to illness) had been a member of it and had committed to the Methodist Episcopal Church.

In 1866 by conference action, the Rotterdam church at Fisher Corner in Schenectady - which had been paying 1/3 of the pastor's salary and was part of the Guilderland charge since 1860 - was split Class No. 8 transferred Apr. 18, 1866 to Rotterdam off from Guilderland along with the State Road church to form their own charge.



& State Road Charge, along with Classes 1 & 4.

McKownville UMC's oldest record book is an 1860 – 1878 ledger of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Guilderland (or Hamiltonville). This ledger includes information on marriages, baptisms, and members at the Rotterdam & State Road churches before the split and also at McKownville (the "Mission on the East") in addition to the Guilderland church.

In the News: The State Road M. E. Church at Parkers Corners (intersection of Guilderland Road/ Route 158 with Old State Road) sometimes appeared in the weekly news, such as:

About <u>1890</u> there was a singing school held there every Friday evening, which perhaps answered the prayers of "the young people of this place (who) are in want of a good singing school teacher for the coming winter."

August 16, <u>1907</u> - There will be no Sunday school or preaching in the State Road church next Sunday. Services as usual the 25th.

In <u>1916</u> a special conference of the official board and pastor of the State Road M.E. church was held Monday afternoon, April 10, at 2:30 o'clock. The church was being papered and painted, and a doorway leading to the hall had been opened. Mr. Sayles of Schenectady had the contract.

September 1935 the Parkers Corners Methodist Church was charging adults at their Harvest Home Supper 50 cents (in 2023 money over \$11) and 25 cents for children under 12 for a menu of roast lamb, mashed potatoes, corn, pickles, rolls, coffee, and jello, and

July <u>1943</u> the Wilderhausen 4-H Farmers held a joint picnic with 4-H girls, Monday evening on the Parker's Corners church lawn.

Charge connections: While I lack current access to many of the Troy Conference journals, the State Road church was affiliated for many years with Rotterdam (called Fisher church some of that time), with 1919/20 the last appointment year there. State Road was joined with McKownville for the 1920-1922/23 appointment years. (1920 was also when the McKownville & Guilderland churches separated.) In 1924, State Road was associated with Carmen in Schenectady. In 1938 Carmen, Saint Timothy's, and State Road were one charge.

Last Days: In the 1915/1916 report State Road had 50 full time members (43 for 1919/1920). By the late 1930s, there was a dwindling congregation. In April 1939 a pastor was again appointed to this joint charge, with State Road reporting 10 full members (but no Sunday school members) and a contribution of \$70 by their Ladies Aid Society. At the 1940 annual conference, there was no report from State Road and it did not receive an appointment.

School Use: The Parkers Corners District 3 (one-room) School burned in November 1942, though the desks, books, and wood shed were saved. The children then had school in the nearby former church building through the 1953 centralization. The church burned soon after this but its bell had been removed to symbolize all the former common schools and is now in a courtyard at the Guilderland High School.



As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.
