


Our church has an ongoing Gift card fund raiser that anyone can participate in and help raise money for the church. The easiest way to get the cards and to get the most bang for your buck is to order gift cards through the coordinator and have them shipped to the church. While an individual can order most cards directly to their house, we have found the delivery charges to that person to be a deterrent. Once a quarter we will be ordering bulk gift cards, and you can get in on it. It is easy to do. In the back of the sanctuary there are gift card order sheets. Just fill

one out with the gift cards you would like, write a check to the church with the memo "Gift card" and leave it in the black locked mailbox labeled payments outside the secretary's office. Kelly Visker, who is the coordinator, will put in the order and get you your cards when they come in. A few ideas for using gift cards:



Bonus Specials: By visiting the Raise Right Web site, you can see specials where certain cards have a higher percentage for a limited time. For example, for this week Outback Steak House is offering 13% back to the church instead of their usual 10%.

"Focal Point"



Focal Point – Defined as: a center of activity, attraction, or attention.



We know that to accomplish a task, we need to focus, *right*? We see athletes focus in the critical moments – a basketball player focusing on a key foul shot with screaming fans behind the hoop, or a pitcher in baseball intensely focused on throwing a strike when faced with bases loaded and a full count. *Not a good time to get distracted!!*

But how often and easily do we lose focus? We know that our

minds often wander, (*perhaps right now while reading this article??*) In fact, studies report that our minds drift nearly 50% of the time! Are we focused on the meeting we're in, or distracted by a text? Are we focused on the car ahead of us, or thinking about tonight's dinner?? It's difficult for us to remain focused on a topic when we're surrounded by so many distractions. Our thoughts can easily be interrupted and throw us off course.

Perhaps the concept of Focal Point can help us refocus and reflect as we journey through this year's Lenten season. These are the days where we can center our thoughts, and purposefully and intentionally remember our Lord sacrificing His life for us. And there is no better reminder for us than the Cross upon which He gave up His earthly life.

With Jesus's resurrection on Easter Sunday, we can look directly at the Cross as our focal point and continually remind ourselves of the world changing event that occurred nearly 2000 years ago. With our lives filled with distractions, changing priorities, twists and turns, we can always look to the Cross as the most steadfast and powerful symbol in our lives. The Cross changed our lives and serves as our gateway to Heaven. On the Cross, Jesus gave up His earthly life to be reunited with His Father in Heaven. In doing so, He won the victory over death and wiped our souls clean of every sin – *past, present and future*.

To rebalance and recenter our lives, we can start by looking to the Cross, during Lent and every day beyond. Regardless of the circumstances we may be facing, we know that redirecting our focus to the Cross will reassure us of Jesus's love for us and His promise of eternal life.



Dear Lord,

As we approach another Easter celebration of your reunion with Your Father above, please help us to join You on Your walk to the Cross. Help us to reflect on your sacrifice for everyone who believes in your name, and never let us forget your willingness to die such a painful earthly death to save each of us from our sins and open the gates to eternal life with You in Heaven.

The Healing Ministry




Welcome, everyone to our Ministry of Healing. We are entering the month of March, 2024, and the days of Lent. During the 40 days of the Lent we need to increase our prayer life, fasting, and helping other people who need help. Also, remember the Passion of Christ and His suffering for us. We are now living in a busy world; but, let us plan for the Lent season. God, The Father, made a plan to send his only begotten son, Jesus Christ, to live among us as a poor man preaching the gospel as well as healing the sick and the blind. He took the persecution and offered Himself as a sacrifice on the cross to bring forgiveness and eternal life for us. Persecution is a very painful experience. In the gospel, in the Book Of Act, the chapter 9, the whole chapter speaks about a persecutor was transformed into a servant of God. During our

Lent days, Act 1-20 is filled with compassion, the power of God, and the healing by the Lord, Jesus Christ.

In Act 9:3, it says that Saul was persecuting the believers. He got a letter from the high priest to go to Damascus. He might take the believers from Damascus to Jerusalem. Saul had a plan for the persecution of the believers. But the Lord, Jesus Christ, had a plan to save the believers. "As Saul neared Damascus, a light from heaven suddenly flashed around him." (Act 9:3). Saul fell to the ground from the power of light from heaven Then he heard, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" (Act 9:4) Saul was shocked and scared, and asked, "Who are you?" (Act 9:5).

I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. Now get up and go into the city and you will be told what to do" (Act 9:6). Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes, he couldn't see anything (Act 9:8) and he became blind. Why did the Lord, Jesus, do this to him?

- 1. The Lord Jesus put Saul under his control to obey him.
- 2. Did not allow Saul to see the believer and the Lord, Jesus, wanted to protect them.
- 3. The Lord, Jesus, put Saul in silence for three days.
- 4. Saul prayed and he may have confessed.
- 5. Receiving vision for his healing from the blindness. (Act 9:11-12)

The Lord, Jesus Christ, watched Saul and heard his prayers. He called the disciple, Ananias, and prophesied about Saul's feature. "This man is my chosen instrument to carry My name before the Gentiles, the kings, and before the people of Israel. I will show him how much he must suffer for my sake." (Act 9:15-16). In this scripture, the Lord is showing compassion over Saul. The disciple, Ananias, prayed for Saul; and, he was filled with Holy Spirit, and his eyes were healed from the blindness. (Act 9:17-18). From this scripture, we can understand about the mighty and healing powers of the Lord, Jesus.

Let us close our eyes and meditate with this prayer. "Lord, Jesus Christ, I surrender myself unto your hands. Wash me with your forgiveness, fill me with the Hole Spirit, and anoint me to spread your gospel everywhere. Thank you Lord for carrying the cross on behalf me, and for offering yourself as a sacrifice on the cross to redeem me. In your precious name I am praying. Amen."

William Wersen, pastor at McKownville 1933/34 - 1935/1936

37. William H. Wersen, 1933 appt. yr. McKownville & Brookview, 1934 - 1935 appt. yrs. McKownville (Brookview in Rensselaer County closed in 1962.)

William H. Wersen lived 1877-1955. He transferred to Troy Conference in 1909. Starting in Old Chatham, the "*Wersens' was a home marked by friends and parishioners as one of an unusually fine Christian spirit and training and of lovely hospitality*." They had a camp at Riparius, NY. William & Elizabeth had four children: Luella, William D., Mariam Lola, and Elizabeth Beryl.



Louise Vedder told in 1966: I remember chaperoning 12 girls from our Epworth League to Riverside [at Riparius]. I have a picture of those girls. There was a minister there, older by action, not by years. He amused us a bit, he taught a class and he wore snickers, high socks, high laced shoes and long sleeved shirts, which was obvious those days. *Two years later he became our pastor – Rev. William Wersen and his charming wife and lovely family. Their son William was janitor, earning money to go to college*. In the winter time they had delivered a load of coal to the church and Rev. Wersen went up to close the windows and check on the fire, walking from Waverly Place [parsonage was at #10] to the church. As he went to close the window, the coal slid and he turned his ankle – and I don't recall if he broke it or had a bad strain, but he hobbled around all winter. Mrs. Wersen used to bake potatoes and beans on the little ledge where you shoved in the coal. If anyone lived frugally, they did, and never any complaint.







As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.
