ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES



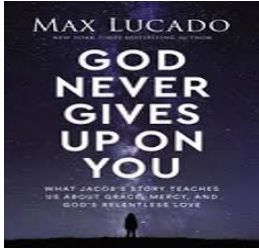
We are very excited that we now have assisted listening devices in the sanctuary that anyone can use. These devices allow people to better hear the service. Each device has a receiver and a set of headphones. Currently located in the back of the sanctuary. You can pick up a receiver from the charging station and a set of headphones from a clean bag. The receivers are already programmed so you just need to plug the headphones into the receiver and put the headphones on.

If you have your set own of headphones or earbuds that you prefer, you can use them instead. At the end of the service please use the sanitizing wipes to wipe down the headphones and place them in the basket. We currently have 8 sets and will evaluate in the future if we need more.

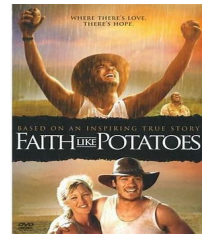

HEALING MINISTRY



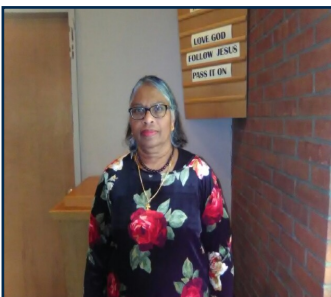
Welcome everyone to our Ministry Of Healing. *"WE WISH ALL THE MOTHERS A HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!"* In our bible, The Book Of Proverbs 31:10-31, describes all about a mother. The quality of mother is a woman, wife, grandmother, and sister, sister-in-law, and mother-in-law. The titles are many, but they are all precious in the sight of God.

A mother is a strong character who has wisdom, is skilled, and is filled with great compassion for others. When we read the Proverb 31:10-31, this explains the strength and dignity of a mother. We may not see her as a model of the ancestors, or imitation of others. A mother's attractiveness comes from her character. Mothers are manufacturers, managers, realtors, farmers, seamstresses, upholsters, and good ambassadors for her family.

Let us remember the mother of Moses, Exodus Chapter 2. In a critical period she delivered the baby boy, kept silent for three months, and then she had the faith and confidence that God would save her boy. She was just going to leave him on the river of the Nile in a basket, but God was with the boy. He saved him and put him in the palace of the Pharaoh, the King of Egypt.

The boy was the freedom fighter for the Israelites. In the book of I Samuel, the woman, Hannah, asked God to give her a baby boy and He did. Her vow was that if she had a boy she would give back to God for His service. The boy became the prophet, Samuel, and anointed the very first King Saul King of Israel. FROM OUR CHURCH HISTORIAN

Mission and Ministry in 1951 at McKownville

Pastor Robert J. L. Williams was another whose first pastorate in Troy Conference was at McKownville, serving here from mid-1947 to mid-1953.



Robert J. L. Williams, born 1921, recorded April 1, 1948: "On an average pledge of 75 cents a week, compared with last year's average pledge of 49 cents a week -- we were able to inform our District Superintendent that this church *no longer needed missionary support.*" [Note that 75 cents in 1948 would be worth over \$9.50 at the end of 2023.] To be seen from the newly built 1950's Thruway, he painted the front doors red at McKownville.

Rev. Williams in his report to the March 1951 Fourth Quarterly Conference extolled the organization of Methodist Men, increase in personal devotional living by families, and start of an adult educational small group in "The College of Living Knowledge."

Other **annual reports** received 1951 included ones from **Methodist Men** [*newly formed February 1951 as a "service organization" with Harold Jonson as President*], **W.S.C.S. [Woman's Society of Christian Service** - with new activities of serving meals to the Methodist Men and two women sent to the Summer Institute at Poultney, Vermont], **Sunshine Class** [youth/young adult women's group which met monthly], **Methodist Youth Fellowship** [whose Intermediate and Senior groups met Sunday evenings], representative to **Albany Federation of Churches**, and **Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, and**

Cub Scouts.

The **volunteer choir** got new robes (partly through their own contributions and by sale of church *Memorial Plates*, etc.) and did Christmas caroling to the shut-ins of the community.

The **Music Committee** investigated purchase of an electronic organ *or* remodeling of the 1927 rebuilt one manual pipe organ. It recommended the former. [An *electric Allen Organ with vacuum tubes* was purchased in 1957 and used until 1991, when it was replaced by an All digital computer organ which is currently in use in the 1960 sanctuary.]

SKYE FARM SUMMER CAMP



How about going to Skye Farm Camp in the Adirondacks? Located on 400+ acres of woods and on a lake, it is ideal for swimming, boating, hiking, and many other fun activities.

At an Adventure camp, you can swim, try out a corchl tube, canoe, kayak, experience a rope course, or explore camp on a new-fangled diggler scooter. Or perhaps creativity or artist camp is more your style. Enjoy creating through improv, skits, plays, dance, art, photography, or music. Skye farm also has a Hook, Line and Sinker camp, a Rocks, Ropes and River camp, a Games camp, a Night Owl camp, and other specialty camps. These are all one-week camps, for ages 6 through young adult, with sessions in July and August.

No matter what camp you choose, you will make new friends, sing songs, play games, have camp fires, and go on a wagon ride. However, what makes the Skye Farm experience unique is that it is a United Methodist Christian camp, that means campers will have opportunities to grow in their faith and build lifelong connections through living out Christian values, reading the bible, and prayer. Short daily morning chapel services and singing grace at every meal is also part of everyday camp life.

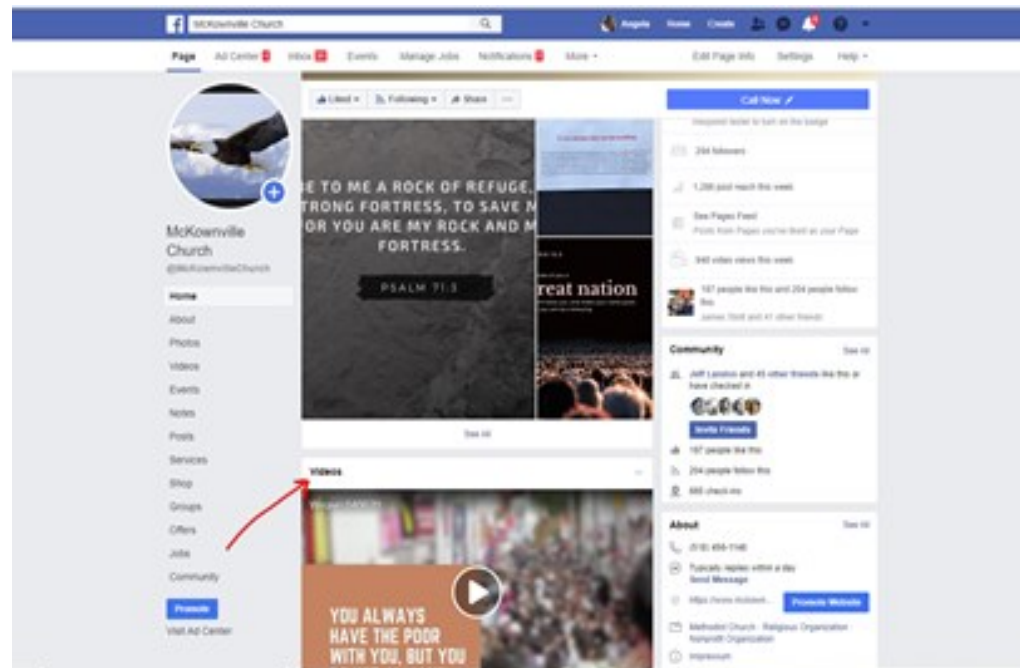

As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.


