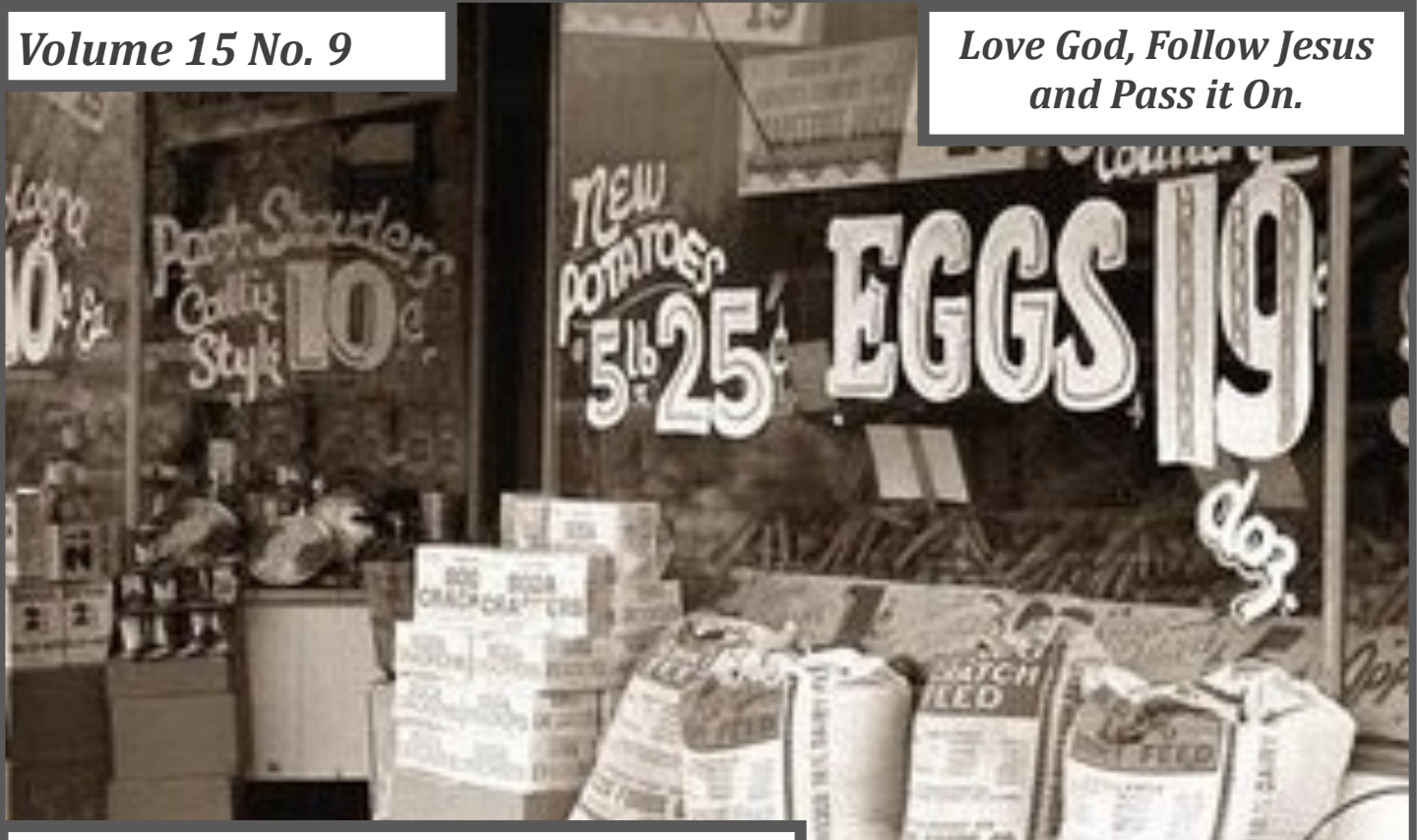

- Everyone is welcome to worship with us in person or watch the service on Facebook or on YouTube.



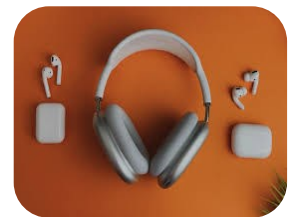
COFFEE HOUR

ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES

We are very excited that we now have assisted listening devices in the sanctuary that anyone can use. These devices allow people to better hear the service. Each device has a receiver and a set of headphones. Currently located in the back of the sanctuary. You can pick up a receiver from the charging station and a set of headphones from a clean bag. The receivers are already programmed so you just need to plug the headphones into the receiver and put the headphones on.

Healing Ministry



Welcome everyone and welcome to the House of God. While all the camping, travelling, and vacations, are slowing down, by the grace of the Lord God we are refreshed and have strength to focus on our daily lives.



When we step into the house of God, He is waiting to welcome us, see us, and speak to us. He always loves us and gives His faith to us. But, do we put all our faith and trust in Him? When things go wrong, changes occur and have struggles wondering if our faith is draining out? We are not living in a peaceful world, but one full of stress and do we get tired of praying? Some people have so many thoughts about their faith. Why do we have to have faith in the Lord God?

Almighty? What is the meaning of faith? The apostle, Paul, says in Hebrew 11:1, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Can we have faith in the bible? In the bible, many faith-filled women witnessed and taught us about faith. We can learn and meditate through the word of Amen.

I would like to introduce a woman from the Old Testament. Her simple act of faith was an amazing lesson for us. She trusted God and activated her strong faith in the middle of her struggles. Elijah left the brook and traveled to Sidon. In 1 King 17:10, it states, when he came to the gate of Zarephath, a widow was there and she was gathering sticks. Elijah called the widow and asked, "Would you bring me a little jar of water so I may have a drink?" The widow saw the thirsty traveler, and wanted to help him. She immediately stopped picking the sticks. As she was going to get some water, Elijah called out to her, "And please bring me a piece of bread" (1 King 17:11).

If this happened in our world today, maybe the widow would have turned and looked at Elijah and said, "Really man, you don't know me and you don't know what is in my home to eat. Are you testing me? I am a poor widow." But let us read what her reply was. As surely as the Lord your God lives she also said, "I have a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug." (1 King 17:12) Then she said that she would gather the sticks, go home, and make the meal. Sounds like she had a plan. She had only one last meal left.

Elijah said, "Don't be afraid. Go home and do as you have said." But first, make a small cake of bread and bring it to me. Then make one for yourself and your son. The widow was listening to Elijah. Again Elijah said to the widow, how is God going to bless the future by this miracle. The jar of flower will be used up and the jug of oil would not dry up. (1 King 17:14) The widow trusted God, the prophet, and did what Elijah said to her. The jar of flour and the jug of oil never dried. Amen.

Her simple faith and obedience brought miracles for the future. The Lord God always provides for his children in the way that is beyond our narrow definition and expectations. The faith is the step between promise and assurance. Let us focus and put our trust in the Lord God and obey. He will bring miracles, blessings, and healings in our lives. Amen.

Learning from Methodist History

Dr. Ashley Boggan D., General Secretary of the General Commission on Archives & History (GCAH), presented on learning from Wesleyan history for today at various annual & jurisdiction conferences in 2024, including her **“Moving Forward with our Past”** at Upper New York Conference.

Boggan named church disaffiliations, the racist jurisdictional structure that segregated Black Methodists for over 30 years, denying women’s calls to ministry until 1956, and harm done to our LGBTQ+ United Methodists as some history we may like to forget.

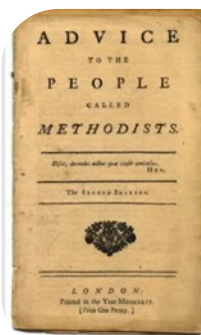
“But if we are going to move on as a new United Methodist Church then, good Lord, we need to reclaim some bits of our past and hold ourselves accountable to other bits,” she said. *“If we fail to do this, then we’ll repeat history and continue to not claim our Wesleyan identity and continue to repeat past harms in new ways.”*

While John Wesley’s heart was strangely warmed in London, it was in Bristol that it was set afire as he learned to bend the rules and do the unthinkable. For example (in 1739), *“At four in the afternoon, I submitted to be more vile and proclaimed in the highways the glad tidings of salvation, speaking from a little eminence in a ground adjoining to the city, to about three thousand people.”* Not only was Wesley preaching outside a church building, in a field no less, but he spoke without the permission of the local bishop.

When castigated by the bishop, Wesley replied, **“Sir, I look upon the world as my parish.”**

Methodists adapted the name given them as an insult, mixed genders in meetings, criticized the slave trade at its height in England, reached out to outcasts - *with their deeds breaking both political and religious norms.*

Being Methodist is faith acted out in love.



- 1) “you are a new people;”
- 2) “do not imagine that you can avoid giving offence;”
- 3) “trust God with your all, then go on in the power of [God’s] might;”
- 4) “Keep in your path...and be true to your principles;” and
- 5) “not to talk much of what you suffer.” (speak of God’s love instead!)

Likewise, God may call us to do something which personally we do not want to do.

To spread the love of God, will we be willing to be uncomfortable?

The first study will be the DVD-based **Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi** with Amy-Jill (A-J) Levine.

Amy-Jill Levine notes "*religion has been defined as designed to comfort the afflicted and to afflict the comfortable.*" Biblical parables serve to do the afflicting - to disturb us. These parables by a Jewish storyteller challenge us to search our hearts and discover more about our faith and our values. Knowing the historical context is important to our understanding. Then we seek meaning for the current day. "*How do we translate them so that they can be heard still speaking?*"

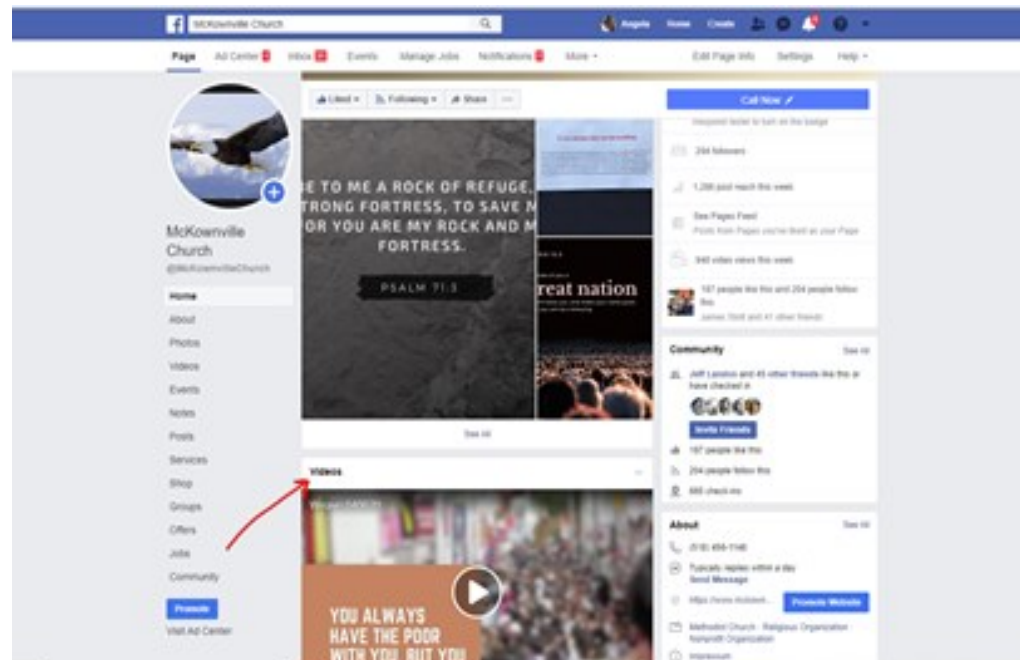

As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.
