Sitting in the Church Sanctuary early in the morning before the Service can be very peaceful. A few weeks ago, just at the right time, sitting in the right spot and looking from the ideal angle, the sun was peering through the stained glass directly through the halo above Jesus's head as He was praying in the garden prior to His Crucifixion. The light beam was intense, and although it only lasted a few minutes until the sun rose higher, the memory of it is still sharp. ***The sun was shining and the Son was shining!***

With the Lenten Season upon us once again, we will be revisiting Jesus' last walk and last words prior to His resurrection. 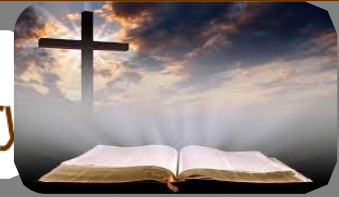

Welcome everyone to our Ministry of Healing. Let us offer our thanks to God for this new month. God almighty guided me to remember the farm lands and the farmers and their families. When we go grocery shopping,

In our bible, Genesis 1:11, describes how God Almighty created the farms. The first farm was created by Him. Then God said, "let the land produce vegetation, seed bearing plants, and trees. Let them be fruit bearing with seeds of various kinds. And it was so." Then God created the man, Adam, Genesis 1:18 says, "Then Lord took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. God created a man first to be the farmer and gardener. Genesis 1:29 says, "The first farmers were Adam and Eve. God said to them, "I give you every seed bearing plant on the face of the earth, and every tree has fruits with seeds. The farmer and his wife taught us about the farm work. They woke us up early in the morning and gave us a list of work to do. We harvested vegetables along with other harvest workers. So when we saw the food on our plates, we understood the hard work and sweat of the harvest workers.

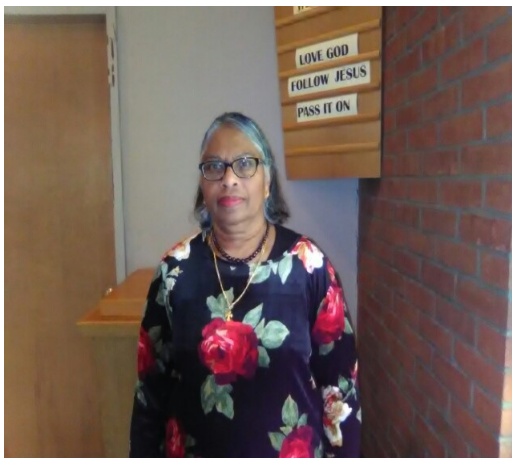


Healing Ministry

**McKownville UMC Sanctuary &
Chapel Memorials in 1970's and 1980's**

Major memorials during this time included twelve stained glass memorial windows installed from 1973 to 1985 in the 1960 sanctuary.

*Full pictures of these windows are in McKownville books
(see at church or buy at Lulu.com).*

1971 – chancel carpeting (\$525, over \$4000 in 2025 monies)
[There were also other rug expenditures at various times.]

1973 – two Edward C. Wise memorial windows – cross & crown, open Bible (\$785 + \$785)

1974 – chapel furnishings in Wesley Chapel donated by the Meek family in memory of John Meek: worship center (\$1616.04 + \$71.20 freight charges) & drapes + rods (\$308.45) material + linings (\$78.23) & lumber for chapel (\$102.94) & paneling for chapel (\$22.10) & carpet runner (\$165) = \$2363.96

1974 – Robert Hall memorial window – cross in chalice (\$1045, about \$6690 in 2025 monies)

1974 – C. O. Palmer memorial window – pomegranate (\$1045)

1975 – Brig. Gen. Arthur G. Eckert memorial window – eagle on fleur-de-lis (\$1240)

1975 – Dr. & Mrs. Thomas Helme and family memorial window (his 3rd daughter Sarah died in 1973) – dove (\$1240) – in book as Smith Family Memorial Window (presumably that of his living 2nd daughter Lulu Helme Smith)

1975 – memorials towards chimes \$407.40 & tapes (cartridges for chimes) (\$180)

Dedicated **1977** – *Ella Alice (Smith) Ostrander memorial window* – lily

Dedicated **June 3, 1979** - *Lucien "Doc" Bowen memorial window* – Jesus + children

Dedicated Thanksgiving Sunday **Nov. 18, 1979** – *Blanche L. Frost memorial window*
(front right of sanctuary)

Dedicated **Nov. 26, 1979** – *Frederic Parker Clifton memorial window* – the earth is the Lord's

Dedicated **1984, March 3, 1985** – *Florence Marie & Arthur Chester Acker memorial window* (listed as in memory of Marie Acker who died 1983) – Lord is my shepherd

Dedicated **November 19, 1989**, - Memorial funds toward purchase of the United Methodist Hymnals in pews

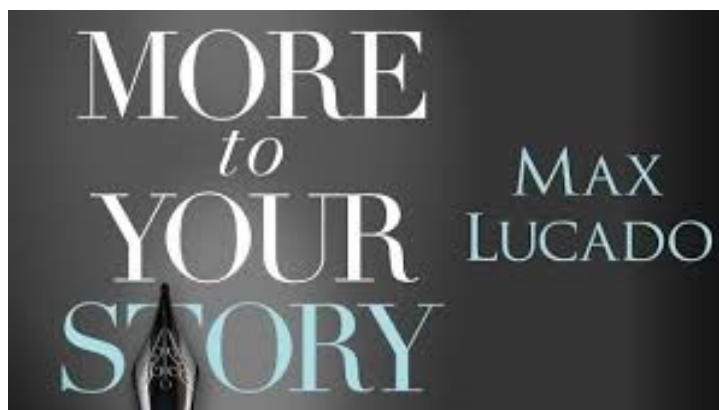

Spring Meeting, Saturday, March 15, Jonesville UMC***

All women are invited. You do not need to be part of a UWF group or be United Methodist. The Albany/Adirondack Districts United Women in Faith Spring meeting will be held on Saturday, March 15 at the Jonesville United Methodist Church, 963 Main Street, Clifton Park. The theme is "**Golden Years: Helping the Elderly.**" NY Connects is a trusted place to go for free, unbiased information about long term services and supports in New York State for people of all ages or with any type of disability. At the meeting, there will be information available from Albany, Saratoga, Schenectady, Rensselaer, and Fulton Counties as well as CAPTAIN Community Human Services and AARP.

The **offering** will go half to UMCOR toward Flood Buckets in response to the recent hurricanes and half to CAPTAIN Community Human Services (which serves in Saratoga, Fulton, and Montgomery Counties, with a Safe Harbour program also in Schenectady County).

Registration begins at 8:45 AM with **Fellowship Time** from 9 – 9:30 AM. The registration cost is \$12, which includes Breakfast and Lunch. Registrations need to be mailed by March 8 or sent electronically by March 10. You can use the form posted in church, the one online at <https://files.constantcontact.com/c9938041501/7d08ebe3-5a1a-4190-9cd3-617fe6f00ec2.pdf>, or contact Nancy Rutenber by March 5 to be included on her form.

Instead of getting something each day like on an advent calendar, you GIVE something each day. At the end of the week, bring your donations to church. At the end of the collection the items will be blessed and then donated to the Guilderland Food Pantry. Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025, starts Lent and should be the first day of your donations.

Meals for the Homeless Shelter

The new location for the Capital District Area Council of Churches' Homeless Shelter in Albany finally opened on February 1, 2025. The shelter is now located at **THE FIRST CHURCH OF ALBANY, 111 NORTH PEARL STREET**. Apparently, there were many more Building Code requirements that needed to be satisfied in this location, than originally planned for, which resulted in the delay in opening.

In addition, the Shelter advised that they needed assistance in purchasing security cameras for their new location and our church was able to use the money we received for the Christmas Eve Offering to pay for the cost of one security camera. The Leadership Council advised that our Christmas Eve offering is typically used to support an "outside the church" mission and since the 2024 offering had not yet been designated, the Council voted to use the Christmas offering to support the Shelter's request.

A big *thank you* to all who have volunteered to provide meals on the second and fourth Wednesdays for February through April this year and for those who have stepped up to provide meals on some Thursdays. Your help is a blessing to the shelter.





Summer is Coming!

Looking for Something Fun to do this Summer?

How about going to Skye Farm Camp in the Adirondacks for a week? Located on 400+ acres of woods and on a lake, it is ideal for swimming, boating, hiking, and many other fun activities.

At an Adventure camp, you can swim, try out a corcl tube, canoe, kayak, experience a rope course, or explore camp on a new-fangled diggler scooter. Or perhaps creativity or artist camp is more your style. Enjoy creating through improv, skits, plays, dance, art, photography, or music. Skye farm also has a Hook, Line and Sinker camp, a Rocks, Ropes and River camp, a Games camp, a Night Owl camp, and other specialty camps. These are all one-week camps, for ages 6 through young adult, with sessions in July and August.

No matter what camp you choose, you will make new friends, sing songs, play games, have camp fires and eat smores. However, what makes the Skye Farm experience unique is that it is a United Methodist Christian camp. This means campers have opportunities to grow in their faith and build lifelong connections through living out Christian values, reading the bible, and prayer. Short daily morning chapel services and singing grace at every meal is also part of everyday camp life.

As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.
