ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES



We are very excited that we now have assisted listening devices in the sanctuary that anyone can use. These devices allow people to better hear the service. Each device has a receiver and a set of headphones. Currently located in the back of the sanctuary. You can pick up a receiver from the charging

station and a set of headphones from a clean bag. The receivers are already programed so you just need to plug the headphones into the receiver and put the headphones on.

From the Desk of Dom Perfetti...

Because He Knows

Years ago, (*yes, now that I think about it many years ago*?,) while attending a training class, six people holding cards numbered 1 through 6 were standing in front of the room. They could see the cards, our class could not. Our job was to find a way to put the card holders in order from left to right, in order from 1 to 6. *Hmm, how do we go about this*? It seemed like quite a puzzle. We all put our heads together and thought if we started to attempt putting them in order and asked if we were right, through data collection and the process of elimination we would have them in the right order in no time!

Well, there's was a much simpler solution that we discovered before we launched into writing the world's best algorithm. All we had to do was ask the participants what number they were holding!! They had the answers in their hands; all we had to do was ask what number they were holding and put them in the right order. A one-minute exercise!!

God knows when to send you exactly what you need. We can often make things much more complex than they need to be, and many times we burden ourselves and avoid asking for the help that we so desperately need. Remembering to pause and take a minute to call on Jesus for help can make all the difference in the world when we're faced with a difficult situation. *How often do we get ourselves tied up in knots and then ask the Lord to unravel the mess we made for ourselves*? Unfortunately, I think we can all agree it happens far too often.

Ida Manville Family and the Methodist Church in McKownville

Ida Strope – who lived on the "road opposite church" [probably Church Road] became a member September 4, 1887 of the Methodist Class No. 1 in McKownville under A. C. Abrams. She had been received via transfer in 1887 by Rev. J. C. Fisher. Ida's mother Mrs. A. Strope joined the class later. There was also a Class No. 2 & a Class No. 3 under other Methodist leaders meeting in McKownville (in addition to classes meeting elsewhere).

Ida **started as organist** of the McKownville Methodist Episcopal Church **in 1890**. On October 17, **1894** *Ida May Strope* (born in Guilderland) was **married** at age 23/24 by minister G. H. LaGrange to *George A*. *Manville* (born in North Greenbush), age 25, who had joined the McKownville church that year. G. A. was a dairyman, first running his own local dairy and later joining W. B. Mynderse at Boulevard Dairy on Northern Boulevard.



George and Ida Manville bought this circa 1890 Queen Anne-style house at *1438 Western Avenue* in 1900. Their **son** *A*. *Earl* Manville was baptized August 12, 1900. Their **daughters** *Mary Jeanette* born April 3, 1902 **and** *Sarah Helen* Manville born September 18, 1908 were baptized at the McKownville church on June 16, 1912 by Rev. H. S. Metcalfe. Geo. & Ida were listed near that time as at *R.F.D. #1, Albany, NY*. The photo shows the house about 1916 with probably the two Manville daughters Helen and Jeanette Manville in front. This Western Avenue house was sold in 1920 to another family. [For more on the building, see https://mckownville.org/images/houses/ HuckFinnHouse-s.html.]

This 1941 newspaper article celebrated Ida (age 69) as one of two living *charter members of the* 75-vear old church at McKownville (formed in 1866 by the Guilderland M.E. church as its 2nd mission church). In a thank you letter to the Official Board meeting March 28th 1946, Ida Manville noted it was a pleasure to play the organ through thick and thin for 65 years. Ida died August 3, 1964 at age 92.

George & Ida's daughter Helen Manville continued after them as a member at McKownville and was a school teacher. She was received as a member April 5, 1925 by confession of faith. Helen is the smiling woman in front in the polka dot dress in this 1990 picture of a United Methodist Women meeting upstairs in the church.

Helen Manville's membership was transferred January 2000 to Brewerton UMC in Brewerton, NY, where Helen died January 21, 2003, age 94.




Sessions Held: Monday Evenings at 7:00 pm

As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is ke+pt in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.


