ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES



Back To School



Another summer has flown by. The school bus is back picking up the kids!! How do the summers go so fast? Seeing the start of another school year made me think of the days when we would get our class books. Remember the math and science books?? Algebra? Geometry? Physics? Some of us may have clicked with these subjects, while many of us may have struggled. And we've all had our classes that we would have preferred not to take at all!!

I often recall a "back to school" example that still sticks with me to this day. Opening my Algebra book to somewhere near the middle of the book was mind boggling. What is this stuff?? Lots of letters, numbers, symbols, little numbers on top of numbers in parentheses??!! How in the world will I ever learn this? Then, class by class, day by day and with a lot of studying and guidance from a good teacher, we arrived at that page around mid-year. Lo and behold, It made sense then! I always considered this a good lesson – Things may not make sense on day one, but with a good teacher, a good book and some focused studying, things begin to com together.

How often do we look at situations in our lives and feel like we're in over our heads and start considering all the possible negative outcomes?? It happens often, and sometimes we don't realize that we ALL have a Good Teacher and a good Book, and when we add the ingredient of putting in our study time, we can adopt a completely new perspective on the challenges we face in our daily lives.

Jesus in our Good Teacher and the Holy Bible is our course book. When we open our Book randomly, we can easily get lost and confused. Welcome everyone to our Ministry of Healing. Prayer is a spiritual communication with God. Everyday some of us will spend time for our personal prayers. Then Peter said, "Look at us." He man looked at them expecting to receive something from them. Then Peter said, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I have I will give to you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." They took the man by the right hand and helped him up and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. He jumped to his feet and began to walk and jump and praise God.

The amazing power of healing touched the crippled man through Peter. How much medical care would be needed today? The crippled man expected help for one day but he received something much better than money. He received permanent healing to walk and work again. His entire life was changed.





Let us read again what Peter said to the crippled man. "In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." Immediately the healing power came from the Lord. This displayed the healing mercy and grace of Jesus Christ and the crippled man was healed. So, from now on there is no need to beg for help or money. No more worries.

I remember one of my best teachers in high school say to the students..... Give Him all your tears, Give Him all your fears, Give Him all your failures that weigh you down, and your questions for your tomorrows. He cares for you more than anybody. Jesus cares for you and He will stand by you more than anybody. Jesus cares for you.

Upper New York Conference's new United Methodist Historic Site




Harkness United Methodist Church, Peru, NY in Adirondack District has been assigned Historic

Site number 582 by the United Methodist Church. Its designation was forwarded to GCAH after its May 24, 2025 approval by Upper New York Conference in honor of Dr. Georgia E. Harkness' accomplishments.

Georgia Elma Harkness (4/1891 - 8/1974) was born and raised in Harkness, NY, which community was named for her grandfather. She considered the Harkness church her "home church" no matter where she lived.

Dr. Georgia Harkness was ordained in 1926 as a *Local Deacon* in the Methodist Episcopal Church and 12 years later she Became a *Local Elder*. She argued that the Church needed the skills and talents of educated women and pressed the issue for women's ordination at worldwide ecumenical venues. A resolution granting *Full Clergy Rights for Women* in the Methodist Church finally was passed in 1956 by the General Conference.

Georgia influenced the church in other ways such as when in July 1937 she was involved in conversations at the Oxford Conference which laid the groundwork for the *World Council of Churches*.



A historic marker was placed at Dr. Harkness' gravestone in 2010.



As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is ke+pt in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.









