ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES

Each device has a receiver and a set of headphones. Currently located in the back of the sanctuary. You can pick up a receiver from the charging station and a set of headphones from a clean bag. The receivers are already programed so you just need to plug the headphones into the receiver and put the headphones on. Kim Keane manages the Sunday school program with many helpers of all ages. Pat Beauregard directs our bell choir. All our choirs are volunteers. Many people serve on our various Ministry Teams: Leadership Council, Staff Parish Relations Committee, Trustees, Finance. Our Treasurer Tim Pearce and Financial Secretary Tom Myers provide financial information all year round. We have two major fundraising events: Kelly Visker has managed the Brooks Chicken BBQ in spring and fall and Angela Stott has managed the pumpkin project to raise money for missions. (I hear the BBQ team is searching for a new leader.) Outreach Ministry team focuses outside our church. In particular, Noreen VanDoren prepares and organizes meals twice a month during winter months for men staying at the Capital District Area Council of Churches' Homeless Shelter. Nancy Rutenber recruits and schedules the lay worship leaders. The communications team sets up our online broadcasts each week and prepares the Powerpoint slides. Tricia Stott heads the Tellers Team. Don't forget about the “unseen” people who trim the hedges, plant flowers in the Spring, fold and stuff printed materials for distribution to the congregation and friends, provide church dinners, bring refreshments each Sunday after worship, altar stewards, lay representation at Conference, and church historian. Finally, everyone from time to time must have contributed to the Guilderland Food Pantry. To all these folks, and to those the Church Mouse failed to remember, many thanks for your contribution in 2025 to the life and mission of McKownville Church. Do you feel left out? 


From the Desk of Dom Perfetti...





As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.




